PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Chattels:

Tadatoshi declared no household chattels in his JP Form, and none were revealed on this file.

Tadatoshi declared in his JP Form, dated April 4, 1942, that he left his nets and lines at the Terra Nova Cannery. These Nets are dealt with in a Net Summary.

Specified Articles:

Koyanagi declared a boat in Custody at New Westminster, B.C., see brown edged Vessels Summary. According to information on file in a letter dated June 16th, 1942 from J.P. Dobell, Capt. Adjutant at Petawawa Internment Camp, the money received from the sale of this boat was paid to Mr. C. KOYANAGI, Reg. No. 05361. No reason for this payment was given.

Securities:

On his JP Form of April 4, 1942, Tadatoshi declared 1 - \$50.00 Victory Bond, (1941), in his own possession. This Victory Bond was cashed by his mother, (see letter of July 14th, 1942 from Hisako KOYANAGI, brother of Tadatoshi.)

Bank Accounts:

Tadatoshi declared on April 4, 1942, \$350.00 in the Bank of Montreal, Hastings and Main, Vancouver, B.C. On May 29th, 1942, in his statement of Assets and Liabilities from Petawawa Internment Camp he declares that he had no Bank Account. These funds, if any, were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

Life Insurance:

\$1000.00 Sun Life Assurance Co.; Beneficiary - father, Chuzo KOYANAGI. The policy was declared to be in his mother's possession, - JP Form, April 4, 1942. On 29th November, 1942, Tadatoshi KOYANAGI referred his insurance premium to his father, Chuzo KOYANAGI, House #12, Lillocet, B.C. for payment. On September 9, 1943, Tadatoshi KOYANAGI states in a letter to this office that he "will pay the premium here", that is at Sheridan, Ontario. On January 25, 1944, the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada was notified to deal directly with KOYANAGI who had been released from internment, and they were advised that the Custodian would have no further interest in this ex-internee's life insurance.

NET SUMMARY

Re: Tadatoshi KOYANAGI
Registration No. 03989

Tadatoshi declared in his JP Form, dated April 4, 1942, that he had left his nets and lines at Terra Nova Cannery. He also declared a gas boat, dealt with in brown edged boat summary.

A statement dated June 5, 1942, from the Manager of Imperial Cannery gives a list of nets marked as Tadatoshi KOYANAGI's. This list is similar enough to that of the Net Statement so that it need not be repeated here. KOYANAGI's original Net Declaration appears under date of March 8, 1946, (it is filed directly behind the Net Statement). As KOYANAGI sold 2200 fathoms of cork and lead lines to the Imperial Cannery, and as he declared approximately 2100 fathoms of cork and lead line on his original declaration, it was assumed that the lines referred to as sold to the Imperial Cannery were those on his JP Form, and these were thus not dealt with on the Net Statement. The nets appearing on the Net Statement are those referred to by the manager of the Imperial Cannery as being the nets tagged at Terra Nova Cannery with Tadatoshi KOYANAGI's name, still in the Cannery Net House as of June 5th, 1942.

A letter dated July 7, 1942, from Petawawa Internment Camp states that if the Custodian can sell these nets and lines for the prices marked on them, the internee, Tadatoshi KOYANAGI, wishes them sold.

A letter dated July 8, 1943, from the placement office, Toronto, states that Tadatoshi KOYANAGI, Reg. No. 03989 claims "there were 7 or 8 of these nets some of them quite new. He thought they were worth something over \$1000.00 and was evidently deeply disappointed that only \$580.00 were received for them."

The total funds derived from the sale of nets was \$750.00. It was believed that Net No. 2145 belonged to Chuso KOYANAGI, Tadatoshi's father, and \$32.50 for the sale of this net was credited to his account, see File No. 1215; on May 7, 1947, an adjustment was made for this amount crediting the \$32.50 to Tadatoshi's account.

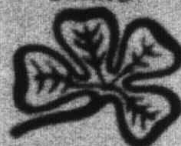



MR. CHERNIACK: There are no amendments, my lord.

TADATOSHI KOYANAGI, the claimant herein,
being first duly sworn, testified
as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. CHERNIACK:

Q Mr. Koyanagi, I show you a typewritten statement.

Was this prepared in accordance with your
instructions? At Yes.

Q Is that your signature? At Yes.

10 Q Do you swear the contents to be true to the best
of your knowledge and recollection?

A Yes.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

MR. CHERNIACK: On behalf of my learned friend I file
his analysis as Exhibit 2, my lord.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

MR. CHERNIACK: I would like to bring to your Lordship's
attention according to Exhibit 2 one of the nets
which was sold for \$100.00 had been appraised at
20 \$125.00. That is the case, my lord.

MR. HUNTER: My lord, it is submitted that the personal
property was sold for its fair market value. I
don't think there is anything there that requires
any great comment. I might ask him about this
\$200.00 net that sold for \$5.00, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes. Would you also deal with the
other net that was appraised at a greater figure
than it was sold at? Does the appraisal appear in
Exhibit 2, the Custodian's analysis?

30 MR. HUNTER: Yes, my lord. It merely shows appraised

to be worth \$125.00, March 14th, 1944.

THE COMMISSIONER: Oh yes.

MR. CHERNICK: Your Lordship will note that these columns in Exhibit 1 are not easily readable because the last price is the last.

THE COMMISSIONER: I observed that.

MR. HUNTER: I am trying to find the appraisal, my lord. Mr. Shears advises me, my lord, that it probably wouldn't be on the individual file. It probably was on a long appraisal by G.P. Leckie where he appraised hundreds of nets and this would be abstracted from that long appraisal.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes, I see. All right, do not bother with it.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. HUNTER:

Q Mr. Koyanagi, there is a net here which you estimate to be worth \$200.00. I will show you the item, and perhaps you could tell us just what type of net it was and the condition, and so forth; this net here that was sold for \$5.00. Have you any idea why that net would be sold for \$5.00 when you valued it at \$200.00? Was it a net that would deteriorate more than the others, or anything like that?

A It is one year old or about two years.

THE COMMISSIONER: Q: It was a year to two years old?

A Yes.

MR. HUNTER: Q: That is when you left in 1942, was it?

A Yes.

Q This was left at the cannery, was it?

T. Koyanagi,
Cross-Exam.

A Yes.

Q The same place as all the nets?

A Yes.

Q How many seasons had you used it?

A Two seasons.

Q And what is the net like that good for, about three seasons?

A: About 2 or 3.

Q And you feel you could have got one more season out of it?

A: About two.

10 Q About two more seasons. That would give you actually four seasons, wouldn't it?

A: Yes.

Q Was this the type of net where you replace a third each year or not?

A: No, about half.

Q You replace half every year? In 1942, when you were evacuated, you hadn't been fishing since 1941, had you?

A: No.

Q Your boat, I presume, having been taken over by the Navy?

A: Yes.

Q So you wouldn't have put on a half a new net in 1942?

A: Oh yes, sure.

20 Q When you weren't going fishing, I presume you didn't do that?

A: No.

Q The last half of a new net you put on, or the last half of a net you put on, would be, I presume, 1941, would it, or do you remember?

A Which one is that?

Q We are still talking about the same net, this one here (indicating). You say that type of net you replace half of it every year, is that right?

30 A Yes.

Q When did you replace the last half? That is when was the last time you made an addition of that half?

A 1940.

Q 1940, for the fishing season in 1941?

A Yes.

Q I see. And your boat being taken away at the end of 1941, there was no need to replace it? Is there anything else that occurs to your Lordship?

10 THE COMMISSIONER: Q: Do you know the Leckie firm who handle fishing gear and nets in Vancouver? It is C.F. Leckie & Company, isn't that the name of the firm?

MR. HUNTER: I believe so, my lord.

A No.

THE COMMISSIONER: Q: Are they not the people who supplied most of the fishing nets, the Barbour nets? A: We used to get them at the cannery, sir.

Q You used to get the nets at the canneries?

20 A Yes.

Q I suppose the canneries bought the nets from Leckie & Company? A: Yes.

Q So if Leckie made a valuation, he probably would be as well a qualified man to value them as anybody that could be found, would he not?

A Yes.

THE COMMISSIONER: That is all, thank you, Mr. Koyanagi, unless you have some re-examination?

MR. CHARNIACK: No, my lord.
