Q. Now, your case deals only with one item
which is a car? A. Yes.

Q. And is this your signature on the document
headed Personal Statement? A. Yes.

Q. Are the facts set out there correct?
A. Yes.

Q. The claim is for a Graham sedan car, 1944,
which you apparently bought in 1949? A. Yes.

Q. Do you recall who you bought it from?

A. I think it was Howell-McDonald on Georgia St.

Q. They are car dealers in Vancouver? A. Yes.

Q. You haven't got the date any closer than
the year 1949? A. No.

Q. You haven't any documents or receipts?
A. No.

Q. You did pay \$225 for it? A. Yes.

Q. And you kept it in good condition? A. Yes.

Q. Then I noticed in the form you say you received
an offer from Ray Grant to pay \$225 for it? A. Yes.

Q. Who is Mr. Grant? A. A friend of

mine. Just before he went overseas he said a friend
of his wanted to buy a car and how about selling my car.
I said I didn't want to sell it, that I needed it for
transportation. I think I could get his address in
Vancouver.

Q. He offered to pay \$200 and you thought that wasn't enough, is that right?

A. Yes, that is right.

Q. I am showing you a receipt; is this the receipt you received from the H.O.M.P. when you turned the car in?

A. Yes.

Q. I asked if you it appears to be in poor condition?

A. Yes.

Q. You turned it in on March 20, 1962?

A. That is right.

Q. What condition were the tires in?

A. Pretty good.

Q. Did you buy new tires at all?

A. I didn't have new ones but they were in good condition for driving, there was plenty of tread on them.

Q. What was your occupation?

Q. You used your car to go to work, did you?

A. Yes.

Q. I am suggesting that the speedometer reading was 44,000 miles and that about the distance you had driven the car?

A. I didn't
