

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Tsuneichi IKEDA, Registration No. 07479

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942. He was evacuated on June 29, 1942.

In his declaration he reported 16 pieces of household goods left at Port Alberni. 13 pieces were shipped to IKEDA on May 20, 1942 at Hastings Park. 1 tub and tools not declared but identified as the property of this man were also shipped at that time. The remaining chattels were sold at auction at Port Alberni in January, 1944, and the net proceeds in the amount of \$22.15 were credited to this man's account.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$5.31 received from the Provincial Government as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

In his declaration this man reported a \$50.00 Victory Bond in the Bank of Montreal. He also reported a \$1,000.00 life insurance policy with the Monarch Life Assurance Co. These items did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

Dear Sir:

In your declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942, you reported 16 pieces of household goods left at Port Alberni. Our records show that 13 pieces were shipped to you on May 20, 1942, together with a tub and tools not declared but identified as your property. The remaining chattels were sold at auction at Port Alberni and the net proceeds in the amount of \$22.15 were credited to your account.

Your account was credited with the sum of \$5.31 received from the Provincial Government as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

You reported a \$50.00 Victory Bond and a \$1,000.00 life insurance policy with the Monarch Life Assurance Co. These items did not come under the control of this office.

Your file shows an admitted indebtedness of \$189.75. We have today, therefore, distributed the balance standing to your credit on a pro rata basis amongst your creditors. This was distributed as follows:

Dear Sir:

In answer to the letter of Jan. 15, 1943, I have found the following mistakes. I do not owe any money to the Vancouver General Hospital. I did at one time, but paid it, and since it was quite a few years ago I have lost my receipt.

When I completed the "JP" form I owed \$65.00 to Dr. Helton of Port Alberni, B.C., but since then, I have paid ten dollars (\$10) on this \$65. These are the only two mistakes that I have found.

Concerning the settlement of the claims lodged against me, I will be unable to pay them for some time. After I was evacuated to the ghost town I have been receiving

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a monthly income of about sixty dollars (\$60.00)  
This is hardly enough to subsist on with  
my wife and children. And with the cold  
weather we have here we are in need of  
warm clothing. But with the income that I  
receive I am unable to provide ourselves with  
all the warm clothing that we need. This is  
the reason why I will be unable to pay the  
claims lodged against me.
