The Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association reported that the insurance was \$500.00 on stock and \$200.00 equipment. No further mention is made regarding the insurance and it is presumed that it was transferred to Mrs. Irene Rutherford, purchaser of the business.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARYRe: YOSHIDA, Yonekusu - Reg. No. 00608.

Yonekusu YOSHIDA signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 1, 1942. The file does not reveal when he was evacuated.

CHATELS: He was the owner of the Felix Confectionery, 1321 West Pender Street. The stock and equipment was sold, in May 1942, to Mrs. Irene Rutherford for \$819.12 paid as follows:

From the first payment, 107.46, the landlord's claim of \$14.00, for rent, was settled and the balance, \$93.46 remitted by the Canadian Credit Men's Association, our agents, to Mr. YOSHIDA. The two payments of \$150.00 were evidently remitted by our agents to Mrs. Yoshida, as had been requested by her husband. The balance was paid in two instalments of \$154.10, also paid directly to Mrs. Yoshida and of \$100.00 which was remitted to this office by the Canadian Credit Men's Association. The sum of \$90.00 was remitted to YOSHIDA on January 30, 1943, the balance being withheld to pay claims which might eventually be filed.

Furniture - On April 1, 1942, YOSHIDA declared certain items of furniture left at 1321 West Pender Street but on April 18 he advised that he was leaving a bed and spring and mattress, sewing machine and a baby crib and mattress with Mrs. R. Lunny at 1311 West Pender. We are writing to ascertain if these are still in her possession. *Retained by F.O. with note "not at this address."*

He also stated that he was leaving 2 dressers and a bench with Mrs. Clark at 1309 Pender Street West. They were shipped in December 1943.

The file reveals that 1 carton of clothing and one trunk were stored at the B. C. Purchaser's Association Warehouse, of which association Y. YOSHIDA was a shareholder. When YOSHIDA requested the shipment of his dressers he entrusted this in the care of one of the members of the Association who was coming to Vancouver to arrange for shipment of goods stored in the B. C. Purchasers. As nothing marked Y. YOSHIDA seems to have been moved to our Warehouse, we can only presume that the carton and trunk was shipped to the Japanese.

MONIES

RECEIVABLE: ^{declared} YOSHIDA that he had \$125.00 owed him in trade debts but did not provide us with the names of the debtors. He stated that his books were in the hands of the police but this was later found to be erroneous. On October 14, 1942,

Claim was denied by Sign Kraft, who suggest it may have applied to some of their employees, several years ago.

2. - Mrs. Frances Grahm, Kesley Bay, B.C. \$6.32

Paid in full, January 20, 1944.

3. - Mrs. Grendall, 1270 Melville Street, Vancouver. \$2.69

Several letters were written to Mrs. Grendall without any results. The current directory does not contain any such name in Vancouver.

4. - Mrs. Fisher, 601 Hornby St. \$23.04

This letter was returned by the P. Office as "no such number".

5. - Mrs. Smith - Insufficient information - no amount given.

The Japanese was advised of the result of our efforts on January 27, 1944.

BONDS

SHARES: YOSHIDA declared one \$50.00 Victory Bond in his possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

The file discloses that he is the owner of 10 shares in the B. C. Purchaser's Association. The affairs of that association are being wound up by Morris & McLennan and should there be any funds available they will be placed on file.

The file does not reveal any other property.

LIABILITY SUMMARYRe: YOSHIDA, Yonekazu - Reg. No. 00608.

Y. YOSHIDA declared two claims:

- 1 - West Coast Trading Co. \$131.00
 2 - B. C. Purchasers' Association. \$21.00

These were later filed as \$42.29 by the Farmer's Products Distributing Co. and \$21.96 by the B. C. Purchasers' Association. YOSHIDA advised us that the claims had been settled and this was later confirmed by Morris & McManis who advised that the claims were adjusted by contra accounts and while they have not been definitely settled, no claim is being made through your office.

3 - Our agents, the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association advised that \$165.82 was owing to the Basselwood Creamery Co. as lien on an Ice Cream Cabinet. The purchaser of the business, Mrs. Irene Rathford assumed the lien as part of the sale price.

4 - YOSHIDA reported to our agents that he owed \$1,000 to his brother Takao YOSHIDA and that no note or security had been given. The Canadian Credit Men's Association advised on May 22, 1942 that T. YOSHIDA had waived his claim.

5 - Hans Peter Andersen, owner of 1321 West Pender Street, formerly occupied by Y. YOSHIDA filed a claim in the amount of \$81.00, being \$26.00 for rent and \$55.00 to replace the plumbing taken out by the tenant. The landlord later filed an additional claim of \$79.00. On May 22, 1942, however, the Canadian Credit Men's Association advised that the claim was reduced to \$14.00, by the landlord. This was settled from money derived from the sale of the business, as per the Canadian Credit Men's letter of August 27, 1942.

There are no outstanding claims on this file.

In response to your instructions of the 30th ult., and authority of the Custodian provided under date of April 6th, 1942, our representative proceeded to the above premises which were described as the Felix Confectionery store in the memorandum to the Custodian of March 30th, 1942. The information obtained is detailed in the same order as requested in your instructions regarding the filing of Agents' reports.

Real Estate and Personal Property:

1. Mr. Yoshida reported that he owned no real estate. Personal property, however, in the nature of household furnishings, is located in living rooms at the rear of the store at 1321 W. Pender St., Vancouver, B.C.
2. Ownership of household effects is claimed by Yoshida.
3. No land or buildings.
4. Details of household furnishings can be supplied if required.
5. No life insurance coverage is reported.
6. We have been unable to verify the title to the personal property.
7. Suggest an effort be made to sell the household furnishings together with the stock and equipment of the business as a going concern.

Business:

1. Grocery and confectionery store located in rented premises at 1321 W. Pender St., Vancouver, B.C.
2. George Yonekuzu Yoshida, trading as Felix Confectionery, claims to be sole owner. We are advised that he gained title to the stock, equipment and certain household furnishings by a Bill of Sale dated Oct. 20th, 1939, given by John R. Tuffley for \$950.00.

3. The following statements are attached hereto:

- (a) Statement of business assets and Liabilities (marked A)
- (b) Inventory of store equipment (marked B)
- (c) List of trade creditors (marked C)
- (d) Inventory of Merchandise (marked D)

Although the information obtained in the foregoing schedules was secured with the assistance of Mr. Yoshida, we are unable to substantiate the accuracy of the data furnished in those statements.

4. Fire Insurance in force is as follows:

\$800.00 on stock and \$200.00 on equipment.

The policy is said to be in possession of Yoshida and was reported as written by the Northwest Fire Insurance Co. Further details are: Policy No. 205749, expiring November 1, 1942 - premium \$9.90; placed through Tanaka Insurance Agencies, 415 Powell Street, Vancouver, B.C.

5. Lien contract with Hazelwood Creamery Ltd. on ice cream cabinet purchased April 15th, 1941, for \$255.00, payable \$10.00 cash, balance five months at \$10.00 per month plus 39 monthly payments of \$5.00 each, with interest at 6% per annum. \$165.82 is said to be the balance now outstanding.

6. We are advised the average monthly sales amounted to \$800.00, producing a gross profit of roughly 17%. Those circumstances being correct, it would seem that the business would provide a small living for an energetic party purchasing the undertaking as a going concern. The store and living quarters, consisting of 4 rooms and bath, are rented for \$28.00 per month. Mr. H. Anderson, agent of the landlord, namely Pender Holdings Ltd., Victoria, B.C., lives in adjoining quarters of the same property and advises that the rent is paid to April 22nd, 1942.

7. It is recommended that immediate steps be taken to effect a sale as there is perishable stock and other items such as biscuits and wrapped packages which may quickly depreciate in value.

General Remarks:

Since our representative completed the inventory of merchandise on the 25th ult., we are advised that Mr. Yoshida continued to operate the business, at least until the 2nd inst. or a few days thereafter. The agent for the landlord advises that key to the premises was not returned to him, but we presume from remarks made by the tenant that it was left at the Custodian's office. We shall be glad if you will advise us concerning the latter feature.

Trusting we may be favoured with your further instructions at an early date, we remain



Further to ours of the 15th inst., we beg to advise that T. Yoshida has waived his claim for \$1000 and that the landlord has reduced his to \$14.00, being rent due on the 22nd April, 1942.

We discussed the attitude of Mr. Y. Yoshida ~~for~~ paying all or part of the costs involved in negotiating and completing the sale, but he took the position that it was occasioned through no desire of his and that the Custodian should bear the burden of all costs pertaining thereto. He further took the stand that the Custodian's department was responsible for payment of the rent accruing after he vacated the premises. The item of \$14.00 indicated above is the amount involved in that connection.



The Custodian's office has written to you on the 8th of November, 1943 and again on the 27th of January, 1944, but has received no reply.

You may consider that as the amount involved is small, our letters may be ignored. However, we would just draw your attention to the following facts:-

The money collected on behalf of the Japanese assists the Custodian in paying the liabilities of these Japanese to other people, many of whom are white people.

The law requires that letters from this office must be replied to; whether you admit the debt or otherwise does not alter the case. For your information we quote below part of the 'Regulations Respecting Trading with the Enemy':-

"Notwithstanding the provisions of any statute the Custodian shall be entitled to receive from any person or from any Department of the Government of Canada such information as he deems necessary to enable him to enforce these Regulation, and any person who, on the Custodian's written request, fails to furnish such information shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations."

We would again request you to give the matter of a reply to this letter your very early attention, as we do not desire to take any further action, but we want to hear your side of the question.

With reference to the claims which you lodged with the Custodian against various individuals whom you state owed the Felix Confectionery money.

We wrote to the five individuals mentioned in your letter of the 14th of October 1942. With regard to Mr. Fred and Harlod, (Signkraft), we are attaching a copy of their letter, dated the 10th of November, 1943, which is self-explanatory.

We have collected \$6.32 from Mrs. Grahm, and this amount has been credited to your account with the Custodian.

You gave no amount against Mrs. Smith so we cannot do anything about that claim.

As we previously advised you, on January 27, 1944, we collected \$6.32 from Mrs. Grain but were unable to make further collections for reasons given you in our letter of that date. Mrs. Gendall failed to reply to any of our letters.

We note that you left certain chattels with Mrs. Clark, 1309 West Pender Street and that these were shipped to you. The articles you stored with Mrs. Lamy, 1311 West Pender, we presume were also shipped to you.

As this office has no knowledge of any property belonging to you remaining in the protected area, your file is being closed.
