

#### MEMORANDUM TO FILE #647 (Internee)

May 20, 1943.

The gas boat license 1341, New Westminster, which appears on this file, apparently refers to a boat owned by some other T. Nakanishi, as the license is dated February 17th, 1922, and Tamejiro Nakanishiwas 27 years old in April, 1942; that is, according to the record, he obtained a Boat license at the age of seven years.

There is no record of the boat carrying license 1341, New Westminster. It is possible that this boat may not have been new in 1922, it had probably passed out of the picture due to sinking, fire or old age, long before the outbreak of war.


