The above noted Japanese Internee declared to the Custodian, on April 7, 1942, that he owned one Motor Boat, naval Number "NW0271" in custody at New Westminster, B. C., valued at \$650.00, and nets, valued at \$600.00, in the net house of the B. C. Packers at Steveston, B. C.

On January 9, 1943, the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee advised that the above noted Vessel was sold to the Canadian Fishing Company on April 11, 1942, for \$550.00, and the net proceeds of \$542.00 were paid to Nakanishi on June 4, 1942.

The nets declared by this Internee were sold at Auction as per the attached Schedule.

The Internee did not declare certain personal effects which were later discovered at his former place of residence and disposed of as per the attached statement. Proceeds of auction sales have been credited to the account of the Internee at this office.

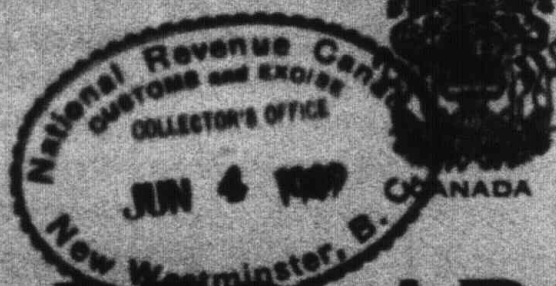



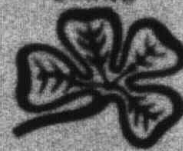

two of these, No. 50, which is a 4/40 x 5 1/2 x 50 x 200,
on lines, one year old, which we reported to you on our
remittance sheet No. 15 under the name of J. Nakanishi.
We also purchased No. 70, which is a 6/40 x 7 x 52 x 220,
reported on our sheet No. 21 under I. Nakanishi.

There was also net No. 66, which is a 4/40 x
5 1/2 x 55 x 270, and No. 69, which is a 9/40 x 9 x 40 x 132.
We have no record of these nets being purchased by the
Company, and may have been disposed of by Mr. Robinson.

MEMORANDUM TO FILE #647 (Internee)

May 20, 1943.

The gas boat license 1341, New Westminster, which appears on this file, apparently refers to a boat owned by some other T. Nakanishi, as the license is dated February 17th, 1922, and Tamejiro Nakanishi was 27 years old in April, 1942; that is, according to the record, he obtained a Boat license at the age of seven years.

There is no record of the boat carrying license 1341, New Westminster. It is possible that this boat may not have been new in 1922, it had probably passed out of the picture due to sinking, fire or old age, long before the outbreak of war.

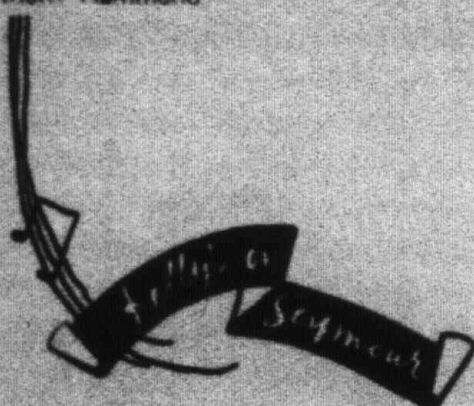


