In connection therewith I have to report as follows:

Locations

This property is located at Hakoda Bay about three miles from the public dock at Ucluslet on the other side of the Inlet close to the entrance, and is accessible only by boat. This is a small Japanese settlement of eleven houses on the waterfront.

Land and Buildings:

The declarent is the owner of 5.80 scree, the legal description being Block 11 of Lot 795, Clayoquot District, Plen 2971,

The assessed values are: Improvements

Taxes for 1942 are paid.

The building is a bungelow of four rooms with Jap both and outside privy. Nator is piped to the kitchen and the Jap bath. The house is built on timber uprights.

The estimated realizable value of the house is \$500,00. Lot 795 is approximately sixty acros of which about five have been elegred back of the settlement. The boundary on the water side embraces nearly the whole Bay which is very beauti-The beach is of shingle and free from rocks. Across the Thiet at Spring Cove the Air Force meintains a sound detection

I have not been able to escertain the boundaries of the various Blocks. The Jepanese apparently considered the ownership of Lot 795 as a community ownership. The waterfront Blooks would, of course, be more valuable, but whether this value would accrue to the benefit of the respective owners I cannot say.

The amount shown as estimated realizable value is besed on the supposition that would-be purchasers ere fishermen.

Personel Property:

Appended hereto is an inventory of the contents of the house which records some differences between the contents es taken by me and declared by the owner. The estimated realizable value of the contents is around \$40.00.

Insurence:

No insurance is carried.

As this is an isolated spot I recommend that endeavours be made to get white fishermen to take up residence here. This would afford protection to the properties and bring revenue to the owners. It is adjacent to the fishing grounds. I have made enquiries lecally with a view to getting someone to not as caretelter and take one of the better houses rent free, but was not able to contact anyone. I have requested Mr. Ronald Matterson the agent appointed by the Japanese - to continue looking for someone, and I have seen the Commanding Officer of the eir base, who is giving instructions to the men on the guard boat which anchors off the Bey, to keep a watchful eye on the place. Constable Howell is also advised to keep it in mind.

I further recommend that if no one can be secured to aut as caretaker and if the land is not sold, that the personal offects be removed to a place of safety. With the summer coning on and the denger of fire from visits of curious and careless people, there is a possibility of the settlement being wiped out. No insurance would seem possible under present conditions,

Referring to the concluding paragraph of your letter of the 27th ultimo and to your letter of the 20th July 1942—Your File No. 58, I have sent you another supplementary report in connection with Tamai Tokumatsu—My File No. 81, Your File No. 669—in respect to missing articles. Some of the articles previously reported missing have apparently been found.

The whole question of missing articles was referred to the B. G. Police who placed the matter in the hands of the Constable at Ucluelet. The Constable at Ucluelet in the presence of the wife of the caretaker at Hakoda Bay carefully rechecked the contents of each house using the list of articles listed as missing together with the complete inventories. Certain articles which were listed as missing were found to be on the premises.
