PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

File No. 688

January 26, 1946.

Re: Heisuke KANEKO #11078

In his declaration to the Custodian, March 24, 1942, this man reported the following articles stored at Claxton Cannery, Skeena River, B. C.

A trunk of clothing and a clothes bag of clothes - These were shipped care of the B. C. Security Commission on May 18, 1942.

Box of Kitchen utensils and a can of rice - Groceries and other items identified as the property of this man were sold at auction in Prince Rupert on July 29 and 30, 1945., and the net proceeds of the sale, \$12.74, were credited to his account.

Three water tanks valued at \$150.00 - The file reveals no record of the disposition of these.

Cohoe net and winch - A coho net and gurdy were purchased from this man by British Columbia Packers Ltd. at \$35.00 and \$40.00 respectively. From this sum was deducted \$1.00 to cover insurance placed on these articles by the cannery, and the balance of \$74.00 was paid direct to Heisuke KANEKO by the Custodian on April 10, 1942. While a gurdy and a winch are not the same, it is quite possible that an error was made at the time of the declaration or that it was a winch not a gurdy that was sold.

The declaration of this man lists \$15.00 worth of War Savings Certificates on his own person. These did not come under the control of the Custodian.

He declared a Bank Account in the Royal Bank of Canada, East End Branch, Vancouver, of \$500.00. This did not come under the control of this office.

The name of "H. KANEKO" appeared on the list of depositors of the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Company in connection with three small accounts. This man has sent us acceptable proof that the small balances were his and we have transferred to his account the funds involved, \$4.04.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.
