On his declaration to the Custodian the above named declared he owned \$100.00 in Victory Bonds which he stated were in the possession of his mother, Mrs. Koma Yoshikuni. Mrs. Yoshikuni was contacted and advised that these bonds had been sold and proceeds used for medicine and personal expenses of the Internee. Eiichi Yoshikuni confirmed this.

Six \$5.00 War Savings Certificates were ^{held} in safe-keeping at this Office and were redeemed for \$26.35 prior to Yoshikuni's departure for Japan.

Bank Account

\$150.81 was forwarded to this Office by the Royal Bank, Cumberland, B.C. and credited to the Internee's account with the Custodian.

Life Insurance

10 "S" class installments in Yorkshire Savings & Loan Association which were redeemed for \$229.35 which sum was sent to his mother, Mrs. Koma Yoshikuni, on request.

Provincial Government refund 1% wage deduction amounting to \$4.29 was placed to the above named's credit.

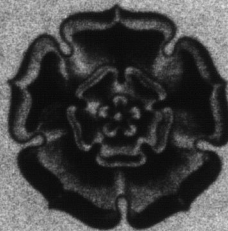

We are in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant requesting information regarding the above's account with this Association.

Mr. Yoshikuni, together with his wife, Mrs. Koma Yoshikuni, hold's 10 "S" Class Endowment Instalment Shares of this Association on which he has made 60 payments of \$5.10. The present withdrawal value of these shares is \$229.89, from which must be deducted the 5% National Defence Tax on certain dividends.

We note that you state Mr. Yoshikuni's deposits amount to \$1,000.00, but the above mentioned 60 payments of \$5.10 each are all that we have received. We would say, however, that if the 180 monthly payments of \$5.10 called for under this contract are made, the maturity value of the account will then equal \$1,000.00. In case of Mr. Yoshikuni's death while this contract is in good standing, a cheque for \$1,000.00 will be payable to his beneficiary.





We are in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant and note contents.

In reply, we wish to advise you that it will not be necessary, in this case, to file and letters of Administration as the only asset of the [unclear], according to our records, is a credit balance of \$20.00 with the [unclear]. These funds were received from the Canadian [unclear] (Banking) [unclear] and represent the savings value of House No. 10, No. 1 [unclear] [unclear], occupied by the late Mr. [unclear]. This house was situated on [unclear] and was owned by the [unclear] Company to whom the ground rent had been paid for some years. We were informed that the right of occupation and use of any structure on the land was to terminate if the company ceased to be an employee of the [unclear]. The above amount, however, was paid by the Company in settlement of the matter after our agent had appraised the house formerly occupied by the [unclear].
