
Gentlemen:

By an arrangement with the Canadian Life Officers' Association, policies of this nature are held in suspense and premiums accumulate, but under the Regulation they are not cancelled.

If any funds are available, the Custodian, at the request of the Internee, will arrange to pay the premium and if the Internee does not desire that the premium be paid, then we will advise you and discuss the question of cancellation.



Thank you for your two letters of July 4 with  
respect to the above policies.

We presume from your letter that you are referring  
to the Automatic Premium Loan Provision in the policy which  
provides that those premiums which are not paid shall be  
advanced from the cash value as a loan and that such premium  
advances accumulate at interest. However, we would point  
out that this does not apply to these two policies because  
three full years' premiums have not been paid and, consequently,  
the policies have no cash value. This being the case, the  
policies have lapsed and are not in force.

Dear Sirs:

I have your letter of July 17th, and wish to thank you for same.

Both of these parties having been interned, their property, being enemy property, has vested in the Custodian, and this includes their Life Insurance. The Policies, therefore, under the Regulations, cannot be cancelled for non-payment of the premiums. Arrangements to this effect have already been made with the Canadian Life Officers' Association in Toronto some time ago.

The general policy agreed upon by the members of the Association was that they would place enemy policies in suspense and if the Custodian had funds available he would endeavor to pay the premium. If he does not pay the premiums, however, they are not to be accumulated as loans against the policy. The Contract itself is to remain in force. Therefore, the policies you refer to cannot be cancelled at this time. If they were cancelled prior to the internment of these parties, the Custodian would not be interested.
