Dear Sires

I have your letter of July 17th, and wish to thank you for same.

Both of these parties having been interned, their property, being enemy property, has vested in the Gustodian, and this includes their Life Insurance. The Policies, therefore, under the Regulations, cannot be cancelled for non-payment of the premiums. Arrangements to this effect have already been made with the Canadian Life Officers' Association in Toronto some time ago.

The general policy agreed upon by the members of the Association was that they would place enemy policies in suspense and if the Custodian had funds available he would endeavor to pay the premium. If he does not pay the premiums, however, they are not to be accumulated as loans against the policy. The Contract itself is to remain in force. Therefore, the policies you refer to cannot be cancelled at this time. If they were cancelled prior to the intermment of these parties, the Custodian would not be interested.
