PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

June 14, 1946.

Re: Tadashi KADOWAKI, Reg. No. 10382

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942. He was evacuated on March 25, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a boat "Fortune Maid" in custody at Prince Rupert. The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this boat was sold and the net proceeds, being the price of the boat less balance due purchaser, less supervision costs, in the amount of \$160.50 were paid to KADOWAKI on April 11, 1942.

He reported a clothes bag in store at Hastings Park. We assume he took this bag with him on his evacuation.

He reported a \$50.00 Victory Bond and \$50.00 in War Saving Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

He reported a \$1,000.00 endowment policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. in his own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$5.00 as refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of his vessel "Fortune Maid".

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

In your declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942, you reported owning the "Fortune Maid" in custody at Prince Rupert. The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this boat was sold and after the deduction of the balance due the purchaser and the supervision costs, the amount of \$160.50 was paid to you on April 11, 1942.

You reported a clothes bag in store at Hastings Park. We understand you took this bag with you on your evacuation.

You reported a \$50.00 Victory Bond, a \$50.00 War Savings Certificate and an endowment policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. in your own possession. None of these items came under the control of this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
