PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Tomojiro KADONAGA

Reg. No. 10423.

This man was evacuated on August 28, 1942. He signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942.

In his declaration he declared a gas boat valued at \$475.00 in custody of the Navy at Prince Rupert. The only vessel of which we have a record, in which KADONAGA had an interest, is the vessel "T.K. #4" which is described in the vessel summary. This vessel was in custody in New Westminster and was released to the licenced owner, B.C. Packers Ltd on April 27, 1942.

On August 2, 1944, B.C. Packers Ltd. informed us that they had paid to KADONAGA on April 20, 1942, the sum of \$75.00 in full for his equity for this vessel. They stated that the vessel was valued at \$375.00 and a debt of \$300.00 was owing to the company.

This man declared 14 boxes of shoe-repair machinery, leathers etc. at Prince Rupert. These boxes were shipped to Vancouver on April 21, 1942, and the equipment was rented by the B.C. Security Commission at Hastings Park from May 1st to September 30, 1942 at a rental of \$10.00 per month which was paid to this office. The equipment was rented by the B.C. Security Commission at Tashme from March 1, 1943, at the same rental. Payments were made to the Custodian up to the end of November 1943, when we advised the B.C. Security Commission that future rentals should be paid direct to KADONAGA. The total sum received in connection with the renting of this equipment was \$140.00 which was credited to the account of KADONAGA.

KADONAGA declared 6 boxes of furniture and personal effects stored with HEIDA TRANSFER, Prince Rupert. These were shipped to him on May 19, 1942.

He declared 8 boxes of furniture in the Japanese Hall, Fulton Street, Prince Rupert. Although a letter from the B.C. Security Commission dated December 9, 1942 reports that KADONAGA had stated nothing belonging to him remained at Prince Rupert, 3 boxes of effects were shipped to him on March 25, 1943 and 3 boxes of sealers identified as his property were sold at Prince Rupert auction in August 1944, for the net sum of 79 cents which has been credited to his account.

On March 14, 1945, an electric motor was sold at Vancouver auction for the net sum of \$18.54. This sum has been credited to the account of KADONAGA, but there is nothing on file to show why this has been done.

A radio described in the Specified articles memorandum was reported by the R.C.M.P. This radio was sold by the Custodian for the net sum of \$8.54 which has been credited to his account but is being held until he sends to this office the R.C.M.P. receipt for this radio.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

I, MALL DEEN, of the city of Port Moody in the Province of British Columbia, Labourer, do solemnly and sincerely declare as follows:-

1. Many years ago, at the request of Tomojiro Kadonaga (hereinafter in this my Declaration called the 'Japanese') I loaned to him the sum of \$100.00 and the Japanese agreed to repay the same to me in one month from the date of the loan. The Japanese did not repay the said sum of \$100.00 as promised nor has the Japanese ever repaid to me the said sum of \$100.00 and the same is still due and owing by him to me.
2. Some time after the said loan, I heard that the Japanese had left Vancouver and had gone to Prince Rupert and I never heard again from or about him until I was informed that the Japanese was at Hastings Park, Vancouver either in the month of April 1942 or shortly prior thereto.
3. Upon hearing that the Japanese was at Hastings Park aforesaid, I saw my friend Munshi Ram and talked the matter over with him and Munshi Ram told me that I had better obtain a Promissory Note signed by the Japanese acknowledging that the amount was owing to me. Munshi Ram gave to me a form of Promissory Note and which had nothing written on it. I then went to Hastings Park and talked the matter over with the Japanese and he then wrote out the note and gave the same to me.
4. The Japanese told me that he had the machinery at Prince Rupert and suggested to me that I should advance the freight money to bring the machinery from Prince Rupert to Van-

couver and I then offered to put up \$20.00 to pay the freight if the Japanese would authorize me to sell the machinery and deduct the sum of \$120.00 from the purchase price. I then informed the said Munshi Ram of what had happened and I handed to Munshi Ram the said Promissory Note for \$100.00 signed by the Japanese. I am informed by the said Munshi Ram and verily believe it that he went to see his Solicitors, Messrs. Hamilton Read & Paterson in order to get a document drawn authorizing me to sell the machinery and deduct the said sum of \$100.00 and the freight charges estimated at \$20.00 from the sale price of the machinery and for the balance to be paid to the Custodian. I am informed by the said Munshi Ram and verily believe it that he ~~saw~~ the said Hamilton Read & Paterson and they drew a document a carbon copy whereof is now produced and shown to me and marked Exhibit one (1) to this my declaration. I am further informed by the said Munshi Ram and verily believe it that he requested the said Hamilton Read to draw a further document in reference to the debts, if any, owing by the Japanese and thereupon a document was so drawn and now produced and shown to me and marked Exhibit 2 to this my declaration is carbon copy of such document. On the same day or a day or so after, Munshi Ram and I went to Hastings Park and there saw the Japanese and he then signed the originals of Exhibits one and two.

5. I am informed by the said Munshi Ram and verily believe it that the said machinery was delivered to the Custodian. I paid the sum of \$20.00 for the freight charges on the said machinery from Prince Rupert to Vancouver. I ~~was~~ subsequently ~~been~~ repaid the said sum of \$20.00.

6. I am informed by the said Munshi Ram and verily believe it that the originals of Exhibits 1 and 2 and the said Promissory Note for \$100.00 signed by the Japanese were handed by him to the Custodian.

7. I say that the Japanese is justly and truly indebted to me in the said sum of \$100.00.

AND I MAKE this declaration conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the 'Canada Evidence Act.'

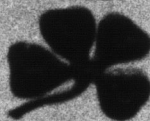

Dear Sir:

Your file with this office has been reviewed, and it is noted that in your declaration to the Custodian you stated that you were the owner of a gas-boat. The vessel you reported was, we understand, the "T.K.#4", which was released in April, 1942, to the licensed owners, British Columbia Packers Ltd. British Columbia Packers Ltd. have informed this office that this boat was valued at \$375.00, that the sum of \$300.00 was due the company by you on the purchase price of this vessel, and that, on April 20, 1942, the company paid you \$75.00 in full for your equity in the boat.

You reported 14 pieces of shoe repair machinery at Prince Rupert. This equipment was shipped to Vancouver in April, 1942, and was leased to the British Columbia Security Commission at Hastings Park from May 1, 1942, to September 30, 1942. From March 1, 1943 to the end of November, 1943, this equipment was leased by the Commission at Tashme. The rental paid on this equipment was \$10.00 a month, which was paid to the Custodian to the end of November, 1943, when we informed the Commission that all future payments in connection with the lease of your equipment were to be made direct to you. The Commission paid to the Custodian the total sum of \$140.00 in rentals of this machinery. From this sum we paid to Mr. Mall Deen the sum of \$100.00 in full settlement of your indebtedness to him. The sum of \$40.00 was re-
mitted to you on December 28, 1943.

You also declared six boxes of furniture and personal effects stored with Haida Transfer, Prince Rupert. These were shipped to you on May 14, 1942. The greater part of the chattels which you reported were stored at the Japanese Hall, Fulton Street, Prince Rupert, were shipped to you. The only saleable articles remaining at Prince Rupert were sold for the net sum of 79 cents which has been credited to your account.

A radio, which we were informed was surrendered by you, has been sold by this office for the net sum of \$8.54. This sum of \$8.54 will be placed to your open credit if you will send us the receipt which you were given when the radio was surrendered.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and send us the receipt for the radio, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
