\* The Prudential Ins. Co. advised us in letter dated Feb. 19/47, that Bunshiro IWASA had applied for the cash surrender value of his Policy Nos. M3067896 & M4773061. In letter dated March 17/47 the above Ins. Co. stated that they had approved the cash surrenders of these two policies in the amounts of \$145.42 & \$54.38 respectively, and that the cheques, drawn to the order of the insured, Bunshiro IWASA, and beneficiary, Haru IWASA, his wife, had been mailed to their Port William office for delivery to the insured.

Mr. Bunshiro Iwasa, before evacuation, resided at 1020 Queens Avenue, New Westminster, B. C., which real property was registered in the name of his son, Kazuo Iwasa, File No. 4037. Bunshiro Iwasa declared in his JP Form dated March 28, 1942, leaving a large quantity of goods stored at the above address and on July 30, 1942, Westminster Trust Company made an inventory of all effects left by the Iwasa's.

Kazuo Iwasa also declared a list of effects left at the above-mentioned address but same is almost identical to the list declared by his father, except he stated that Mrs. Shigehiro, File No. 4077, had furniture stored/1020 Queens Avenue. Mrs. Shigehiro's effects were sold at auction and proceeds credited to her account in this Office.

A copy of Westminster Trust Company's inventory was forwarded to Mr. Bunshiro Iwasa on October 1, 1942, and he signed same on December 22, 1942, stating that said list represented all his chattels remaining in any Protected Area of B. C.

Westminster Trust Company were requested by us to obtain a signed acknowledgment from the tenants, Mr. and Mrs. Ellis, of the goods left in their care. However, they would not sign an acknowledgment as they were not using said effects but promised to take reasonable care that the rooms in which they were locked were not disturbed.

All effects were removed from 1020 Queens Avenue to our auction rooms where they were sold on January 28, 1944, February 25, 1944, March 15, 1944, September 27, 1944, October 27, 1944, and at Vancouver Auction No. 66, said sales realized the net sum of \$319.09.

Under instruction from this Office Trapp Motors Limited appraised and sold a cabinet to Mrs. Poirier and a quantity of lumber to Mrs. Clayburn the net proceeds of which amounted to \$7.50.

All effects belonging to the above-mentioned Japanese have been disposed of except 1 parcel of photos stored in the Buddhist Temple, 120-10th Street, New Westminster, B. C.

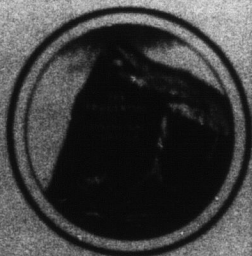
