The above named declared no chattels to the Custodian, but in April, 1946 he wrote advising that he had left the following articles at The Continental Daily News, 315 E. Cordova Street:


- 1 New Steel double bed (complete)
- 1 C.C.M. bicycle
- 1 Cloth Bag containing personal belongings

He was advised that no articles tagged with his name were found at the Continental Daily News and as he did not declare such chattels to the Custodian, before leaving Vancouver, there was nothing we could do for him.

Clothes, sold at Vancouver Auction No. 56 on December 7th, 1945, have now been identified as the property of Fujimoto and his account has been credited with \$1.64. However, no trace has been found of the bed and bicycle.

No property interests, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.

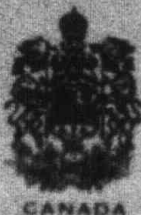
