MEMORANDUM RE PERSONAL PROPERTY

Re: P/WA-53, KAKIUCHI, Iwakaau

One cloth bag, containing personal belongings, which was stored in our warehouse, was shipped to the Internee at the Internment Camp on July 12th, 1943 at his request.

Kakiuchi owns a Kodak V.P., Model B, Serial No. 22115, which is at present in the Custodian warehouse.

\$50.00 War Savings Certificate, which we held in safe keeping, was cashed and proceeds placed to the Internee's credit.

The Internee claims to be the owner of a three room house built on a property owned by his deceased father, Iwakichi Kakiuchi (file 14090) and Ichitaro Nariwa (file 1732) which is described as Parcel 1, Bl. "B", Sub. of part of Sec. 20, Twp. 1, Plan 2486, Barclay District. Rental of \$5.00 per mo. for the house has been credited to the joint acct. of the property owners in order to take care of taxes etc.

This house is several years old and appears to have been built some years before the Internee became of age. There is nothing on file except the Internee's own declaration to substantiate his claim to ownership of the house.

The Estates of Iwakichi Kakiuchi and Ichitaro Nariwa are being administered by the Official Administrator, Port Alberni, B.C. and eventually the Internee will be credited with his share (being 1/9) of the Estate.

The Internee declared various household articles which he left stored in the house at Bamfield B. Mr. Green states that these effects were mostly stolen when the house was broken into and that the few remaining articles should be included in the sale of the house. (see Memo. of June 4th, 1945)

The Internee has no funds at credit with the Custodian but has a credit of approximately \$30.00 at the Internment Camp.

1. On the evening of the 18th instant a raiding party of Csts. Robson H.E. & Wallace, V.C. and myself searched the Victory Rooms, 300 Block Powell St. where the above named Japanese was found to be a delinquent for not reporting on April 13th, 1942 as instructed by Notice No. 83 attached from the B.C. Security Commission. Subject when questioned stated he did not wish to leave the Defence Area for a work camp or other project but would rather be interned.

2. Subject was Naturalized in 1936 and reporting as an Enemy Alien, Certificate of Parole No. 159235. His last report to the Registrar of Enemy Aliens was made on March 10th, 1942. Subject had no excuse to offer for not reporting since that date.

3. Subject was placed under arrest and handed over to the Military Guard, Canadian Immigration Building, receipt for his living body attached.

4. Parole Certificate No. 159235 attached for cancellation.

We wish to thank you for your letter of the 6th instant enclosing Notarial Copies of Letters of Administration which were granted to you in connection with the above two estates.

Unfortunately we have not yet received any satisfactory offers on the two pieces of Real Property involved in these estates but we will, as, if and when we do receive offers which approximate the valuations, immediately report same to you.

The Canada Hio Company Limited is presently being liquidated by Messrs. F. S. Ross and Sons, Chartered Accountants, with offices in the Royal Bank Building, Vancouver. The latter firm has been appointed Liquidators of this Company and, as soon as the affairs of same have been wound up and shares distributed, funds will be forwarded to you.

Isakichi KAKIUCHI, deceased, was the owner of a fishing vessel named Loyalty "K" and same was sold by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for \$1,300.00. The net proceeds amounting to \$1,282.00 were paid to the son, Isakam KAKIUCHI, who in turn gave \$300.00 to his brother, Noboru KAKIUCHI.

We wrote these two sons regarding the disposition of these funds and we enclose herewith for your information the replies to our letters.

In reply to the above named Internee's Prisoner of War Business
Letter of the 16th instant, will you kindly inform him that we cannot
comply with his request that we remit to him the sum of \$25.00.

Before internment this man declared to the Custodian that he
was the owner of certain real property and the income from the property
was credited to his account with the Custodian, from which disbursements
were made on behalf of the Internee. Upon investigation it was found that
the real property was not owned by the Internee but by his deceased father,
Isakichi KAKIUCHI and one Ichitiro WAKIWA, also deceased. The assets of
these deceased parties are now in the process of administration.

Disbursements made for the Internee exceed his personal funds by
\$11.44, and this amount will be deducted from his share of his father's
estate when distribution is made.

For the Internee's information we give below a summary of his

The house on the property is claimed by the Internee Iwakazu KAKIUCHI, son of the deceased Iwakichi KAKIUCHI. However he made this declaration subsequent to his father's death. He is a single man aged 23 at date of evacuation. Mr. Bell informs me that the house is several years old and appears to have been built some years before the Internee became of age. There is nothing on file except the Internee's own declaration to substantiate his claim to ownership of the house.

The rentals of the house totaling \$90.00 have been credited to the Internee and he presently has a balance to his credit of \$78.56.

Should we credit the rentals to a joint account in the names of the registered owners leaving a debit balance of \$11.44 in the Internee's account and pay arrears of taxes from the joint account.

The Internee appears to have a 1/9 interest in his father's account which would ultimately cover the debit in his account.

We have blocked the funds at the Internee's credit.

Dear Mr. Ackland:-

Information on our files reveals that Iwakichi KAKIUCHI died at Banfield, B.C. on January 1st, 1942 and Ichitaro KAKIUCHI is said to have died 13 years ago. Both are said to have died intestate.

Title to the property described as Parcel No. 1 (P.D. 62897-1) of Block B. of Section 20, Tp. 1, Barclay District, Plan 2486 is registered in the names of Iwakichi KAKIUCHI and Ichitaro KAKIUCHI. This property is assessed at \$100.00 for the land and \$900.00 for improvements. Our file also shows 22 shares of Canadian Rio Company Limited, in the name of Iwakichi KAKIUCHI. 

Land and Buildings:

Land:

The house described is erected on the foreshore of Pt. E. of Fr. of the N.E.¼ of Sec. 20, Tp. 1, Map 2486.

According to the records of the Provincial Assessor's office, Alberni, B. C., I Kakuichi is the assessed owner of the land. The declarant in his registration form stated "This house built on property belonging to father Mr. I. Kakuichi".

The assessed values are:

Size - small wedge.

Taxes amounting to \$2.00 have been paid for 1942.

The rocks on the land at the rear of the buildings are precipitous and rise to a height of thirty to forty feet from the shoreline. On the top the land is covered by a heavy growth of brush and small trees and cultivation would be difficult.

Building:

This is a three-roomed bungalow built on piling on the foreshore. Construction - wood frame. Built about six to eight years ago. Two outside sheds. Lean-to. Jap bath. No brick chimney. Condition is fair and might rent for \$5.00 a month. There is no landing wharf. Possible sale price of the property would be in the neighborhood of \$150.00 to \$200.00, if a purchaser could be found.

There is not much demand from Bamfield residents to rent houses in this locality and local fishermen would not pay much rent for a house of this type.

Caretakers:

The Japanese occupant of this house appointed Mr. and Mrs. Andersen as caretakers of their property and personal effects. I enclose a copy of a document handed to me by Mrs. Andersen when I inspected the premises. Mrs. Andersen lives close by and has offered to be of assistance in any way possible. She claims to know practically all of the Japanese families who lived in this vicinity.

Personal Property:

I attach a detailed inventory of the contents of this house as at the date of my inspection. The item referred to as "1,000 ft. China Flooring" I assume refers to approximately 500 ft. of lumber (tongue and groove) stored under the house.

Apparently another Japanese lived in this house as well as the declarant. Mrs. Yoshigoro Kawaguchi (Registration No. 11879) has made a declaration of ownership of goods and chattels said to be on these premises. The items enumerated in her declaration form are described in detail, whereas the reference in declarant Iwakazu Kakiuchi's registration form is given in a general way. It will be noted in this man's declaration form he states, "House built on property belonging to father, Mr. I. Kakuichi who lives in the same house."

Insurance:

The building is not insurable as it has no brick chimney.

Liabilities:

None are recorded.

Special Action Taken:

On my arrival at Bamfield on 7th May 1942 to report on the properties in this district, I was informed that at Grappler Creek certain fishing boat equipment was lying around outside houses, which was of value and could easily be stolen. I arranged to search

the ground in the vicinity of the Japanese houses and remove to storage in Bamfield any such equipment of value. In and around these premises two gurdies were found. It is not possible to determine the actual owners of these, although they were found outside this house.
