Vessel: This vessel is dealt with in Vessels Summary. The vessel was sold by Tadayoshi MITSUBATA through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, and the net proceeds of \$388.50 were paid to him direct on March 30, 1942.

Radio: This is dealt with in Specified Articles Summary. The net proceeds of \$12.92 were credited to this man's account.

Securities: \$25.00 War Savings Certificates in owner's possession. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Bank Account: Canadian Bank of Commerce, Prince Rupert, B.C. Account No. 3235 - \$551.50. This did not come under control of Custodian.
Japan & Canada Trust Savings Co., Vancouver, B. C. Account No. 1805 - \$98.75. This account is not on the list of accounts of the Japan & Canada Trust Savings Co. - File 13806, and it is assumed that all funds were withdrawn.

This is an inquiry concerning my radio. During the outbreak of the war, the B. C. Police of Prince Rupert, per G. D. Mead, took into his possession my Phonola 6 tube battery radio set, number 291500.

Before the war, I was allowed to purchase this radio without any government official interfering my obtaining it. As the war broke out, I was forced to surrender the radio. I understood the circumstances and so willingly forwarded it to the police but did not attempt to keep it secretly.

Now that the war is over, I would like to have the radio back. Also as I am working in this logging camp with very little means of communications and hardly any entertainments of any kind, I would greatly appreciate your kindness if you would be able to forward the machine to me by C.O.D. Express, per C.P. n.

Dear Sir:

Custodian cheque in the amount of \$12.92, representing all funds standing to your credit in this office, was sent to you through the Department of Labour on this date.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that you signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942, and were evacuated on May 30, 1942.

In your declaration you stated that you were the owner of the Motor Vessel "Royal Star", and that the Anglo-British Columbia Packing Co. Limited held a lien for \$500.00 on this vessel. According to information supplied to this office, the "Royal Star" was sold by you through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee on March 27, 1942, for the sum of \$900.00. At the time of sale the lien of \$500.00 was paid off. Supervision costs of \$11.50 were paid to the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, and the balance of \$388.50 was paid to you direct on March 30, 1942.

Your radio was sold by the Custodian and the net proceeds of the sale, in the amount of \$12.92, were credited to your account.

You declared \$25.00 War Savings Certificates in your own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

It is noted that you declared an account with the Japan & Canada Trust Savings Co. in the amount of \$98.75. As your name did not appear on the list of depositors of this company, it is assumed that you had withdrawn all funds from this account.

On August 6, 1942, you wrote this office in regard to household goods at North Pacific Cannery. It is our understanding that these goods are the property of your father and are dealt with in his file.

The only funds received in this office on your behalf were the proceeds from the sale of your radio in the amount of \$12.92, and our cheque for this amount was forwarded to you separately as we have already stated.


Dear Sir:-


