PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

April 3, 1946.

Re: Yoshio MAYEDA, Reg. No. 10945

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 24, 1942, the day before his evacuation.

In his declaration he reported 100 gramophone records, 3 boxes of books, 1 Cohoe net left at Claxton Cannery. The inventory of this man's property taken by Mr. Dave Smith while at Claxton Cannery in April, 1942, shows 2 boxes stored in the company house at Claxton. This file gives no indication of the disposition of this man's chattels. It is possible, however, that these were shipped to him by the cannery manager. At any rate no chattels belonging to Japanese remain at Claxton Cannery.

This man reported ownership of a vessel in custody at Prince Rupert and stated that he was indebted to the B.C. Packers Ltd. for \$250.00. The vessel "Chrysanthemum M" was released from custody to the B.C. Packers Ltd. on April 1, 1942. This vessel was licensed in the name of the B.C. Packers Ltd. and was valued at \$1,100.00. According to information supplied by B.C. Packers Ltd. on September 8, 1944, the company paid to MAYEDA direct the sum of \$850.00 in settlement of his equity in this boat. As MAYEDA reported he was indebted to B.C. Packers Ltd. for \$250.00 and it is noted that this indebtedness was settled by this transaction.

The account of this man has been credited with the sum of \$5.00 received in full settlement of claim for refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of the vessel "Chrysanthemum M". This claim was filed with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee.

At the request of Seiichi MAYEDA, father of this man, we are transferring from the father's account to the account of Yoshio the sum of \$5.00 received in settlement of the claim for expenses incurred in connection with the impounding of the vessel "Kiyoko".

This file reveals no other property.

It would seem that Mayeda had been purchasing this vessel from your company under a Conditional Sales Agreement.

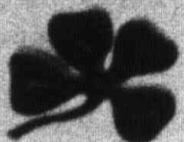
Would you kindly give us details of the settlement made with Mayeda when your company took over this vessel?
