PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

April 3, 1946.

Re: Seichi MAYEDA, Reg. No. 10914

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942. He left the protected area on April 2, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a quantity of personal effects left at Claxton Cannery. Of these effects 2 trunks, 12 boxes, 4 baskets and 1 barrel were possibly shipped on the Custodian release signed by his wife on May 18, 1942. The following are absolutely unaccounted for: 1 sewing machine, 1 trunk, 8 boxes, 100 gramophone records, 2 tubs of Japanese sauce, 1 box of carpenters tools and 1 box of plumbers tools. These items may possibly have been shipped to MAYEDA by the manager of the cannery. At the present time no chattels belonging to Japanese remain at the cannery and no chattels belonging to MAYEDA were sold by the Custodian.

In his declaration this man reported the sum of \$750.00 owing to him by the B.C. Packers Ltd. on the purchase of 2 fishing vessels. The 2 fishing vessels concerned were the "Kiyoko" and "Kiyoko II" which were sold to the B.C. Packers Ltd. through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the total sum of \$1,350.00. The purchasers withheld \$852.71 to satisfy a mortgage, \$547.29 was paid in to the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee. From this sum \$18.50 was deducted to cover the Committee's charges and the balance of \$528.79 was paid to MAYEDA on April 1, 1942.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$10.00 in full settlement of two claims filed in his name with the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of his 2 vessels. MAYEDA has informed us that his son, Yoshio MAYEDA, is entitled to \$5.00 of this money and this amount is being transferred to Yoshio MAYEDA.

The Kodak camera surrendered by MAYEDA is being shipped at his request to his son, Masaru MAYEDA, file 832.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

CHATELS SUMMARY

In his declaration of March 25, 1942, this man declared the following chattels:

One pedal sewing machine, which was inventoried by Mr. Dave Smith on his visit to Glaxton Cannery in April, 1942, but is not accounted for.

He reported 3 trunks, 20 boxes of groceries and dishes, 4 baskets, 3 tubs of Japanese sauce, 2 boxes of tools. Mr. Smith inventoried one trunk, 17 boxes, 8 cartons, 4 baskets, one keg and 5 tubs of sauce. Therefore the Japanese reported 32 containers of various kinds, and Mr. Smith inventoried 36 containers.

Masaru MAYEDA, son of this man, File 832, reported 2 tool boxes, a gramophone and records, a box of clothing and a box of books, while Mr. Smith inventoried for this man, 3 chests, 5 boxes and one trunk. Masaru MAYEDA, on June 3, 1942, requested shipment of 3 boxes. One box of books was sold and the proceeds credited to Masaru MAYEDA.

Yoshio MAYEDA, son of Seiichi, File 828, reported 100 gramophone records, 3 boxes of books. Mr. Smith inventoried 2 boxes (contents unknown). There is no record of shipment or sale of these.

We therefore have for the MAYEDA family a total of 41 items (exclusive of the sewing machine) declared, and a total of 43 inventoried. Requests for shipment cover 22 containers, and one lamp. One box of books was sold. If shipments were made as requested 24 of the items inventoried have been accounted (if the lamp was in a box by itself). If Mr. Smith's inventory is accepted, there are 19 containers of various kinds missing, and one sewing machine.

Nothing now remains at Glaxton Cannery, according to B. C. Packers Ltd. and Mrs. E. E. Arnold, Custodian agent at Prince Rupert. Mrs. Arnold reports also that nothing removed from Glaxton remains at Prince Rupert.

There is no record of any recent inquiries from this family in regard to their chattels, and it is quite possible that all effects of any value have been shipped to them.

We have received from your son, Masaru, a receipt for a camera which was surrendered to Naval Service in February, 1942, by Mr. M. NAKAMURA of Port Essington on behalf of Mr. MAYEDA of Glaxton. A camera which we believe to be the same is in Custodian warehouse at Vancouver. This camera was reported by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police as being the property of Mrs. Seichi MAYEDA. Unless you inform us that you do not desire to have this camera sent to your son we will ship the camera to him as he has requested. We will hold the camera until April 15th, to enable you to reply.

Your son, Yoshio, has sent us a request that we send him the sum of \$5.00 which was received by the Custodian in full settlement of the claim for refund of expenses in connection with the vessel "Kiyoko". This claim was reported by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee as having been lodged by Mr. Seichi MAYEDA and this sum has been credited to his account. Would you kindly let us know if your son, Yoshio, is entitled to this refund. If so, we will transfer the sum of \$5.00 to his account and send him the funds.

Would you please let us know the name of the fisherman who delivered the "Kiyoko II" to Prince Rupert at the time this vessel was impounded.

We would appreciate an early reply in order that we may deal with the requests made by your sons at as early a date as possible.

In accordance with arrangement made with Mr. McKinnon, we would appreciate receiving any information you can supply in regard to shipments made to the above-named persons.

The chattels of these persons were stated to have been left at Claxton Cannery, Skeena River, B. C.

On May 18, 1942, Mrs. Hatsuyo MAYEDA signed a Custodian Release requesting shipment of some goods (17 pieces are listed). She stated these were in the care of Mr. Harry McCoover, at Mr. Hamack House, Claxton Cannery, Skeena River. As Mrs. MAYEDA left the protected area on June 22, 1942, it would appear that she was in Vancouver at the time she signed this release, and possibly the goods were shipped to her at Vancouver.

On June 3, 1942, Masaru MAYEDA signed a Custodian Release requesting shipment of three boxes, which he stated were in the care of Mr. McCoover.

Any information you have regarding goods shipped in response to these requests or any other shipments made to any members of this family will be of assistance in completing our records.
