Dear Miss Matheson:

In reply to your letter of October 13th, we wish to advise that the vessel "Queen Mary" is now lying on the beach at Annacis Island, New Westminster.

This vessel apparently at one time was used as a logging camp tender. She is about 36 feet long.

When taken into custody, the remains of a four cylinder Vivian engine, approximately 25 years old, were scattered around the hull.

The hull was examined by an experienced boat builder in the presence of Commissioned Engineer J.M. Murphy. The planks were found to be teredo-eaten, the stem rotten from top to bottom, as were also the keel and stern post. A man could put his hand through the planks at any place. The condition of the wood and the design of the vessel would indicate that she must have been built between forty to fifty years ago.

How this vessel held together during the trip from Simoon Sound to New Westminster is one of the minor miracles of the day. Why she was taken from Simoon Sound can be explained only by the fact that conditions prevailing at the time made the speedy removal of boats from Japanese hands imperative. This, and the small number of men that could be spared for the work, led to a number of boats being taken into custody that should have been left lying on the beaches. There wasn't time to examine each boat to determine its condition.

We understand that the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee received a bid of \$25.00 for the "Queen Mary" in March, 1942. This bid seems to have been withdrawn later. At any rate, the boat was not sold.

As a boat, the "Queen Mary" must have been valueless at the time of impounding. We would suggest that the owner's claim for the loss of this vessel be placed on file until such time as higher authorities decide as to what action is to be taken to recompense the Japanese for minor claims.
