
Life Insurance: In a statement to the Custodian, Ichiro MORIMOTO declared that he was the owner of a \$1,000.00 life insurance policy with the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada. Form "D" on file indicates that Policy No. 2,291,086, issued on the life of this Japanese, was a \$1,000.00 - 25-year endowment plan, taken out on March 25, 1940.

Premiums due 1942 and 1943 were in arrears when the above Internee requested the Custodian to obtain the cash surrender value of this Policy. On January 25, 1944, the Sun Life Assurance Company forwarded to this office their cheque, amounting to \$6.09, representing cash surrender value of the above-mentioned Policy.

At the request of Risaburo MORIMOTO, father of the insured and beneficiary of this Policy, these funds were forwarded to the Internee at the Camp.

No property interests, other than those mentioned above, are found on this file.





in this camp as I have no balance left in my account here.

dollars from my account when the proceeds are credited.

We are in receipt of your enquiry of 23rd instant.

In compliance with the Internee's request of October 26th, application for cash surrender value of his Policy #2291266 was filed with the Sun Life Assurance Company and cheque for \$6.09 has not been received. The cheque was made payable to the Internee and beneficiary and we are awaiting written approval from Mr. Rinsuro Morimoto, beneficiary, to our placing the cheque to the Internee's credit.

We have no other credit in the Internee's account and it is, therefore, impossible for us to comply with his request for \$25.00 and Parker Fountain Pen. We will, however, forward the \$6.09 as soon as possible.
