Fishing Equipment: In his JP Form, dated April 15, 1942, Kunio MUKAI advised the Custodian that he had left the following fishing equipment at the Carlisle Cannery at Skeena River, B. C.:

- 1 Cohoe Net, 200 fathoms
- 1 Spring Net, 200 fathoms
- Compass
- 4 Lanterns
- 1 Roller
- 3 Wrenches

The following were left at Steveston, B. C. Box 443

- Dog fish hooks, 1,200
- Rope, 180 fathoms

On May 26, 1943, the Custodian was advised by the Manager of the Carlisle Cannery, Skeena River, B. C., that the above-mentioned fishing nets did not belong to this Japanese as he had not paid for them and they were, in fact, still the property of the Canadian Fishing Company Limited.

There is no indication on file that any of the above noted articles came into the custody of the Custodian. However, Custodian Inventory No. 434 lists one dunnage bag and particulars on file indicate that contents of same were disposed of either to UNRRA or discarded as of no value.

No property interests, other than those mentioned above, are found on this file.



Dear Sir:-

We wish to acknowledge your letter dated May 17/43., regarding property belonging to Kunio Mukai. The two nets mentioned in your letter did not belong to this man.

These men took new nets from our net-loft and if they paid for them in full the old net was considered his. They paid so much each year on these nets until the amount was paid in; after which they could do what they liked with them. These nets had not been paid for by this man and are Company property as he only paid a seasonal payment of rental.

There are several rollers, wrenches, and considerable other materials stored in a house here, but as we cannot identify these items, we cannot take them out and sell them.

We would be glad to get rid of the materials we have on hand. A considerable amount of them are marked for the man they belong to, and some have no marks which makes it very difficult.

We sold all the nets and lines that actually belonged to our different Japanese last year and made remittances to the Custodians department. Nets depreciate quickly and any now on hand would not be much good. Those of any value were sold last year.
