August 26, 1946. File No. 848 Re: Junii MATSUSHITA, Reg. No. 10951 This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 25, 1942. He was evacuated on March 29, 1942. In his declaration he reported a box of carpenters tools left at Cassiar Cennery, Skeens River. This was shipped to him on May 15, 1942. He reported personal clothing at Hastings Park. We assume he took these with him on his evacuation. He reported \$45.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office. The records of the Japanese Pishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this man was the owner of a vessel "Phyllis Homs" which was sold and the net proceeds of \$690.50 paid to the Gassiar Packing Co. on April 2, 1942 on instruction from MATSUSHITA in a letter written March 25, 1942. The R.C.M.P. hended to this office a Victor mantel radio with 3 batteries and a Phonola mantel radio with one battery, a 616 Kodak camera and a 620 Kodek camera. The two radios were sold and the net proceeds of these two radios in the amount of \$35.62 were credited to the account of this man. The two cameras are still on hand. Common mailed Septeo/46. Funds remulted This file reveals no other property of any kind. This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file. Grachison August 26, 1946.
