PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

June 26, 1946.

Re: Takashi ONO, Reg. No. 09943

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 31, 1942. He was evacuated on May 2, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a 1939 Plymouth car in custody. This car was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$609.59 were credited to the account of this man.

He reported a bank account in the Bank of Montreal, Victoria, with a balance of \$139.31 and two life insurance policies. None of these items came under the control of this office.

The R.C.M.P. notified us that this man had surrendered 3 cameras to them at Victoria. These cameras were released to the B.C. Security Commission on February 10, 1944 for shipment to ONO.

On October 13, 1943, ONO requested us to purchase Victory Bonds to the value of \$300.00 from the funds held to his credit with this office, and these bonds were placed in our Safety Deposit Box. In July, 1944, coupons valued at \$6.00 were cashed and this amount credited to his account. In February, 1945, coupons valued at \$4.50 were cashed and this amount credited to his account. On February 15, 1945, we remitted to ONO the amount of \$315.59 and his three \$100.00 Victory Bonds, leaving \$4.50 in his account. We are remitting this to him today.

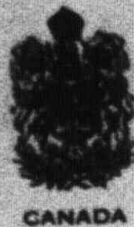

On October 13, 1943 you requested us to purchase Victory Bonds to the value of \$300.00 from these funds and in July, 1944, coupons valued at \$6.00 were cashed and this amount credited to your account. In February, 1945, you requested that the Bonds and the amount standing to your credit be remitted to you. Before forwarding the Bonds we clipped the coupon due on each but these had not been credited to your account when we remitted to you the balance standing to your credit, \$315.59, and your three \$100.00 Bonds in February, 1945.

You reported a bank account in the Bank of Montreal, Victoria and two life insurance policies. These items did not come under the control of this office.

The R.C.M.P. notified us that you had surrendered three cameras to them at Victoria and our records show that these were released to the B.C. Security Commission for shipment to you in February, 1944.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge receipt of cheque we enclose a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
