With reference to the attached files, I think the sum of \$35.00 received from the sale of outboard motor #113 should be transferred from the account of Kisaburo ONO, Reg. 07775, File 1460, to the account of Kiyoshi ONO, Internee File 872.

Kiyoshi ONO, formerly of Ocean Falls, has declared ownership of a speed boat left at Ocean Falls.

The boat from which Engine #113 was taken was sold by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee and the net proceeds of this sale, \$19.80, have been credited to the account of Kiyoshi ONO, Internee 872.

Kisaburo ONO, formerly lived at Sarita Bay, did not declare ownership of a boat.

If you consider this sufficient evidence of Kiyoshi ONO's ownership of the Elto Outboard, listed as Engine 113, would you please have the monies received from the sale transferred to his account?

We wish to acknowledge receipt of Prisoner of War Business Letter dated 11th instant from above named, in connection with proceeds received from redemption of 12 \$5.00 War Saving Certificates belonging to him. Mrs. Tomiye ONO, wife of the interned, requested that we send proceeds to her for maintenance, and, after securing authority from above named to do so, a cheque for \$48.80 was forwarded to her on April 13th. On April 29th, we received the cheque back from the British Columbia Security Commission, together with letter advising that Mrs. ONO wished the money credited to her account, which was done. We trust this is the information desired.

In accordance with interned's request, we are attaching hereto cheque for \$19.90 for his credit in Canteen Fund. This amount represents balance at credit in his account. We would appreciate receiving acknowledgment of same.


Dear Sirs:

Re: Ocean Falls Vessel No. 2
ONO, KiyoshiReferring to your letter of the 5th
instant, file 872, herein.

According to our records, there was a small speed boat amongst the vessels held at Ocean Falls under the custodianship of the Provincial Police, belonging to this Japanese. If this is the same vessel, it was numbered by our surveyor as "Ocean Falls#2" and valued at \$20.00. It was sold on the 16th May for that amount by T. A. Goodridge under our instructions. This amount is reported by us under ledger file, 619A, which I am quoting in case you desire the reference in the future. There was no engine with the vessel, but it may have been taken to Esquimalt by the Navy.

I have the matter of the disposition of all the outboard engines taken by the Navy from Ocean Falls, up with C.O.P.C. at the present time, and will advise your office when I hear from them.
