PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Yoshio MADOKORO, Registration No. 11968

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942. He was evacuated on March 26, 1942.

In his declaration he reported household effects, foodstuffs and furniture at the C.P.R., Vancouver. He took delivery of these, as acknowledged in a letter of September 17, 1942.

Mr. Sharp, Custodian agent, reported 5 pieces of old furniture left in his house at Tofino. MADOKORO also reported a Coleman Gas Lamp left in his house, but this could not be located by Mr. Sharp. As this furniture was practically valueless nothing further was done about it.

This man declared a Sun Life Assurance Co. policy for \$1,500.00. This did not come under the control of this office.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this man owned a boat, the "Crown", which was sold for the total price of \$3,000.00. From this the amount of \$224.32 was paid to the Canadian Atlas Diesel Engines Ltd. to satisfy a claim against the boat, \$220.00 was deducted by the B.C. Packers to cover missing equipment, \$30.00 supervision costs were charged, and on March 17, 1942 the amount of \$2,525.68 was paid to MADOKORO. On September 4, 1942, the amount of \$145.38 was paid to MADOKORO as payment of claim to the Canadian Government for repairs and missing equipment.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$21.75 as payment of claim filed through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of the vessel "Crown".

This man reported a radio surrendered to the Custodian agent at Tofino. This radio was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$28.00 was credited to this man's account, the receipt now being on our file.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$19.64 representing his share in the assets of the Tofino Japanese Association.

This man declared an interest in the house in which he was living, belonging to his deceased father. This estate has not as yet been administered and this matter is therefore not settled.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

On July 30th we referred to the son Yoshio Madokoro, a list of chattels reported by our Tofino agent on the file of the deceased father, Kamezo Madokoro. This was confirmed on September 17th as correct with the exception of a Coleman lamp and radio, the latter of which is held by the Ucluelet police. This lamp could not be found by our agent and must, we are afraid, have been stolen.

The value of the chattels found by our agent was estimated at not in excess of \$5.00.

We acknowledge your letter of the 19th inst. in connection with the above and the matter you mention concerns the sale of fish packers "Western Chief" and "Hiki" and an unregistered scow and fish packing equipment and floats formerly belonging to the Tofino Trollers Co-Operative Association, sold to the North Shore Packing Company Limited for the price of \$11,500.00 cash. This was authorized by a Special General Meeting of the shareholders of the Association held at Tofino on the 3rd day of March, 1942 and the Special Resolution authorizing the same was filed with the Registrar of Companies.

The Meeting unanimously resolved that the sum of \$600.00 be paid to each of the members and that one-third of the share capital of the Company be set aside as a reserve fund and kept in the Bank of the Company as required by the Co-Operative Associations Act.

It was also unanimously resolved that the following officers be paid bonuses in respect of their assistance to the members:

Mr. Komoto, the President	\$ 70.00
Mr. Nakagawa, the Vice-President	50.00
Mr. Y. Madakora, the Treasurer	45.00,

and \$10.00 to each of the Auditors, Mr. T. Sakauye, Mr. S. Nakagawa and Mr. Y. Ezaki.

The Custodian of Enemy Property:

While we do not know about the item of \$30.00 mentioned by you, it probably is the balance of the \$600.00 which was to be distributed among the members.

We believe that Gibson Brothers incorporated under the name of North Shore Packing Co. although possibly Mr. Gibson of the legal firm of Reid, Wallbridge, Gibson & Sutton may have further information as he is Solicitor for the North Shore Packing Co. and drew the Agreement which was signed by the Tofino Trollers Association.

Extract from report of Const. D. H. Howell, in charge Ucluelet Detachment, B. C. Police, dated 23rd March, 1942, respecting Japanese at Ucluelet, Frasers Bay, Waitland Island, Spring Cove, Port Albion, Leeches Bay and Tofino.

re: JAPANESE PROPERTY - Disposal of, Ucluelet and Tofino.

The above properties at present under the care of C. W. Sharp. Very little property left; either sold or shipped to Vancouver for storage. No inventories taken of property left behind due to hasty evacuation.

One school house, to the value of \$1,000. owned jointly by the Claycoquot Tofino Trollers Association (Japanese) and in the name of Mitsuzo Nakagawa, legal description unknown by undersigned.

One house purchased by Haru Kimoto, with lot to the value of \$1200. but as payments on the property to former owner have not been completed, the Title Deed is not in Kimoto's name.

The other Japanese residents rented h uses from John Eik, Tofino. A certain amount of furnishings, fishing gear left in these houses being cared for in the meanwhile by Mr. Eik. No inventories taken.

The balance of Japanese property at Tofino was shipped to Vancouver when evacuated and the small amount that has been left behind is well packed and stored in their homes; all windows being boarded. I understand that the Japanese Custodian of properties has been in touch with Mr. C. W. Sharp and has received a more detailed description than above.

All Claycoquot Japanese residences, which have been rented from P. Malon, owner of the island under the care of William White.

Special Police Reserve in Tofino making routine patrols of all mentioned houses.
