This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 28, 1942, and was evacuated on March 29, 1942.

Chattels: This man declared ownership of a large quantity of household effects, left at 208 Vernon Drive, Vancouver, his former residence. On November 17, 1942, this office advised MADOKORO, that when Custodian representative visited these premises, he was informed that MADOKORO had sold or otherwise disposed of his personal property before his evacuation. Mrs. MADOKORO was evacuated on May 4, 1942, and in letter of October 5, 1945, she informed us that she had left all her property at the home of Mrs. Bond (c/o Morris Confectionery, 2280 East 45th Street, Vancouver) and that she had sold her chattels to Mrs. Bond for the sum of \$90.00. This letter from Mrs. MADOKORO is the first letter received from either of these people since their evacuation.

Radio: The radio, dealt with in Specified Articles Memorandum, was reported by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, but was not declared by MADOKORO.

Life Insurance: Sun Life Assurance Company Policy No. 2236335, for the sum of \$1,000.00, beneficiary - wife - Policy in possession of beneficiary. This did not come under the control of this office.

Moneys Owing To Him: The Custodian received from the B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd. the sum of \$4.45, being refund of security deposit for light. This sum was credited to MADOKORO's account.

This file reveals no evidence of ownership of any other personal property of any kind whatsoever.

Dear Sir:

Your file in this office has just been reviewed, and it is noted that, on March 28, 1942, the day before your evacuation, you signed a declaration to the Custodian stating that you were the owner of a considerable quantity of household effects at your former residence, 208 Vernon Drive, Vancouver.

When the Custodian representative went to 208 Vernon Drive, following the evacuation of Mrs. Madokoro, none of your chattels could be found, and it was reported to this office that all your personal goods had been disposed of before your evacuation. This information was passed on to you in our letter of November 17, 1942, but no reply in confirmation or denial has been received from you.

Your wife, in her declaration to the Custodian, dated April 28, 1942, stated that she owned no property of any kind in the protected area. This office found later that some personal effects belonging to Mrs. Madokoro had been left with Mrs. Bond, 2280 East 45th Street, Vancouver, and on October 5, 1945, Mrs. Madokoro informed us that she had sold a quantity of furniture and other chattels to Mrs. Bond for the sum of \$90.00, which had been paid to Mrs. Madokoro direct.

It would appear that all chattels belonging to yourself and Mrs. Madokoro have been disposed of by yourselves, either before or since your evacuation.

The radio, which the Royal Canadian Mounted Police have reported as having been surrendered by you, has been sold. The net proceeds of this sale are \$17.62, which will be available to you if you will send us the receipt which was given to you when the radio was surrendered.

The life insurance which you declared did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The sum of \$4.45 has been received from the British Columbia Electric Railway, being refund of security deposit for light. This sum has been credited to your account.

Your letter of October 17, has been received, and it is noted that you wish me to confirm this matter. It states also that the Custodian Agent Miss went to check up after my wife's evacuation. One thing I do not understand is why he could not have come so much sooner. My wife was there till the 4th of May.

My wife states that during that time she had heard that the house was already rented to another family and was ready to move in immediately after her departure. Therefore, she had no means, but to leave it with Mrs. [unclear]. The reason why she had stated no property in her declaration, was that Mrs. [unclear], owner of Mrs. [unclear]'s residence informed her at that time, that she would get in a declaration together with her own, she found out. For some reason, however, that it was under her name separately instead of under Mrs. [unclear]. All this which leads to such application.

You also state about missing of a letter to me on November 17, 1942, which I have not received.

It is true about the statement you made of Mrs. Bunker's telling what was left to Mrs. Bond for the sum of \$20.00, which she sent a receipt direct to her. The only part, however, seems to be stolen by Mrs. Bond's letter.

Enclosed you will find the receipt which was given to me when the auto was surrendered, which I hope will meet with your approval.
