With further reference to the vessel "M.U", N.035-B, attached is a letter received from the Registrar of Shipping, Nanaimo, B. C.

You will see that "Masakazi" UYEYAMA owned boat, License #724. This is quite probably the same man as our "Masakazu".

The two boats described by the Registrar are approximately the same size. It is quite possible that Uyeyama purchased this boat from Masakichi Shin, but, instead of having the previous license cancelled, secured a new license (ignoring the previous one), and then continued to operate his boat under Shin's license. This has happened in other cases.

Uyeyama should know something about his boat. He should at least know the name of the previous owner, if there was one.

It is noted that the "M.U. 691", N.035-B declared by Masakazu Uyeyama is 32' long, 7'6" beam, 3'10" in depth, Vivian 8 H.P. Codfish boat.

Mr. Gould's survey covers: "M.U. 691", N.035-B, owned by Minaru Oyeeda, Length:28', Beam 8', Depth:3', Vivian 8 B.H.P., Troller.

I think none of these boats were measured by anyone, and some very poor guesses were made as to dimensions.
