Your recent complaint from above party following her letter from Custodian Agent and shipper, Mr. J. W. James at Nanaimo. For your information I quote the following letter dated December 18t --

"Your letter of the Dec. 18th.

1st paragraph. I don't think she has any kick coming over either the labour charge or freight, she was lucky that it did not cost her a good deal more.

2nd paragraph. When we put the goods in to this Hall, Maruse, Samoshima, Kozia, Moreskita, Togo and others did not exist as far as we knew. We had no record of them, their goods were scattered all over the Hall and we had to make the best of it by packing in name of, no name and further, later we learned that the Hall was used as a School for Japanese and the teacher was KOZIA and further although he had lived in the School some of his goods were stored in other peoples houses, so you see what we are up against now. Mr. Fisher, there will be mistakes from now on and it cannot be avoided, but we will do our best to keep things right."
