PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Re: Shosaku KAWASHIMA
Reg. No. 04358

Chattels:

In 1942 KAWASHIMA declared he had no chattels or goods of any kind left in the Protected Area. However, on April 4, 1945, Mrs. Iwa MUKAI, wife of Yoshizo MUKAI, file #6658, wrote this office saying that S. KAWASHIMA had left goods stored in MUKAI's place at 98 Moncton Street. (This letter appears on file #6658, Yoshizo MUKAI's file). These goods were removed from 98 Moncton Street to Storage #1 (removed were 2 dunnage bags and effects), on March 22, 1945. (See Chattel Schedule).

On May 2, 1946, Shosaku KAWASHIMA wrote this office asking what had happened to his goods left at 38 Moncton Street. This was his first declaration that any goods belonging to him had been left in the Protected Area. He declared that left were:

- 1 clothes bag
- bedding
- 1 large box (with rubber boots, raincoats, etc.)

The Commandant of Angler Internment camp was asked, on May 16th, 1946, to advise Shosaku KAWASHIMA that his goods had been sold, and the net proceeds of \$48.67 had been credited to his account.

After reviewing the files it seems that no goods fitting the description were removed from 38 Moncton Street, and, as the goods removed from 98 Moncton Street so closely fit the description, it was assumed that KAWASHIMA had made an error in the address in his declaration of May 2, 1946.

There is also on file a credit to this account of \$6.70 which was the cash balance of KAWASHIMA which was forwarded from Angler Internment Camp.

There is no other property of any kind revealed on this file.
