



Dear Madam:

We acknowledge with thanks your letter of January 29th, together with list of your belongings which you claim were left at 828 Royal Avenue, New Westminster. This latter will be very useful in identifying some effects which had already been sold, but to which we were unable to give a proper identity.

We may first point out to you however that you did not declare any possessions at time of evacuation and your husband, Mr. T. AOKI, evidently reported that all your household effects were sold. The actual reference reads as follows: "The registrant's wife sold 1 boiler, 1 sewing machine, and the household furniture. The personal effects were taken by Mrs. AOKI to Greenwood, B.C." Next may we point out that you list a steam boiler. Nothing of this nature was found at 828 Royal Ave. and we presume it was disposed of by you before leaving the Coast.

We shall do our best to identify and transfer to your account anything belonging to you that appears to have been found at 828 Royal Ave. and the proceeds credited to Mrs. AKADA. We can do no more than give you credit for goods that were found and as we have stated before, everything found at the foregoing address was merely a jumble of personal effects with no proper means of identifying them. We shall ship the trunk, etc, to you, and it might be as well for us to mention that the sewing machine for which you had signed a Custodian release on March 22nd was evidently the same machine mentioned by the Campbell Storage Co. on March 22nd, 1943, and it was shipped to you at Greenwood.

Your file has now come under review and the following is noted.

You declared a steam presser, fixtures and dry cleaning equipment stored at Campbell's Storage. This equipment was subsequently sold to Mr. A. K. Clark for the sum of \$445.00, this sale being arranged directly between Mr. Clark and yourself as per your letter to us of March 31st, 1945. Storage charges in the amount of \$6.44 were still owing to Campbell's Storage and this amount was paid out of the proceeds of sale of your equipment, leaving a balance to your credit of \$438.56. A cheque for this amount was remitted to you on April 9th, 1945.

In addition you declared the ownership of a boiler and two sewing machines. It is recorded by our agents on July 22nd, 1942, that the boiler was sold by your wife prior to evacuation and one of the sewing machines was shipped to you at Greenwood. The other sewing machine was sold by your wife prior to evacuation. You also declared living room furniture and personal effects, and we find that these goods were either sold by your wife before leaving the Coast, or taken with her to Greenwood.

Although no mention is made on your J. P. form of a radio and record player, you sent us a Custodian Release for these articles dated October 26th, 1945, advising us that they were stored with the J. W. Kelly Piano Co. Ltd. The radio and record player were shipped to you by this Company in February of this year, according to information given to this office by the J. W. Kelly Piano Co.

You declared a Life Insurance Policy with the Sun Life Assurance Company in the sum of \$1500.00, the beneficiary being your wife. You also declared the ownership of a \$150.00 Victory Bond. Both of these were in your own possession and did not come under the control of the Custodian.
