This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on April 3/42 declared goods as shown on Chattel Schedule on file. Her husband, File 1159, also declared goods at House #42, Phoenix Cannery, Steveston and these are also listed on Chattel Schedule on file, and since the proceeds from sale of both their chattels have been credited to a joint account in their name, the Chattel Schedule has been made in duplicate, one for each file.

On July 3/42, Custodian agent, Mr. C. C. Robinson, inventoried goods in the name of Mrs. Seiroku SHIOSAKI which he found in Phoenix Cannery House #44, List #80. A copy of this list was sent to Mr. Seiroku SHIOSAKI, which he signed on Dec. 9/42 and returned to this office. Mr. Robinson also inventoried goods in the name of Seiroku SHIOSAKI on July 3/42 found at House #42, Phoenix Cannery, List #81. A copy of this list was sent to Mrs. SHIOSAKI which she confirmed on Dec. 9/42 and returned to us. Since the lists had not been signed by the right parties, she having signed his list and he hers, we advised them on Oct. 25/45 that we had transferred the proceeds from sale of all chattels to a joint account in their names. Chattels removed from Houses #42 and #44, Phoenix Cannery, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$74.26 and this sum was credited to the joint account of the above and her husband.

The file reveals the above owned no specified articles.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

Dear Sir:

It is our intention to supply you with a brief summary of the administration of your affairs. However, to avoid the delay that would be involved in making a complete review of your file, which is necessary before the final distribution of assets can be carried out, we are enclosing our cheque in your favour for \$90.00 as requested in your letter of September 14th, 1945. This amount was derived entirely from the sale of your fishing nets and equipment.

As you and your wife both confirmed, on December 9th, 1942, the lists of chattels sent to you of goods removed from the Phoenix Cannery Houses Nos. 42 and 44, to avoid confusion, we have transferred the proceeds from all auction sales, amounting to \$41.30, to a joint account in both your names, and as soon as possible the remainder of your funds will be made available to you.
