This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATTELS: The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on April 3/42, declared only 2 dressers stored in cannery house which will be assigned by the B.C. Packers Ltd., on her declaration. Goods were inventoried in the name of the above by Custodian agent, C.C.Robinson at House #21, Pacific Coast Cannery (owned by B.C. Packers) and a list of these was sent to Mrs. MINAMIDE on Nov. 10/42. She confirmed this list and adds a number of other items as shown on the Chattel Schedule on file. Practically all items declared have been sold at auction with the exception of a sewing machine which was among the goods inventoried but is apparently missing. The chattels were sold at auction for the net sum of \$150.90 and this sum credited to the account of the above with this office. It will be noted that in Steveston auctions #39 and 41 that a large amount of clothing was sold. These were found in one large box clearly marked with the name of the above, and as both the above and her husband declared clothing and they had three children it is quite possib that they would have a large quantity.

The file reveals the above owned no specified articles.

MONEYS

The above declared a sum of \$60.14 owing to her for unemployment insur-RECEIVABLE; since by the B.C. Packers. We wrote to the B.C. Packers with regard to this matter on May 6/43 and in their reply dated May 7/43 they advised that they had nothing to do with unemployment insurance that all claims for money from this source should be made to the Umemployment Commission This information was passed on to the above in our letter of May 10/43.

VICTORY BONDs

The above declared a \$50.00 Victory bond in her own possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

No property inte ests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.


