

Dear Sir, re : SATAKE T., Your File 1014.

I have your letter of the 15th instant.

As regards Satake's engine, I quote the following from a letter written to me by Mr. Sinclair, Manager of Inverness Cannery, of August 4th last :-

"Yes, this engine is on hand here and can be shipped at any time. Satake has asked writer to purchase same for the company, but as 4 HP is too small a power for our purpose, we do not want the engine. Writer does not know how much use Satake had of this machine, but believe it is quite an old engine, and would hesitate to put a price on same. However, if the engine will run, it certainly should be worth between \$ 40.00 and \$ 50.00."

From the foregoing quotation, it will be seen that while the market for such an engine is definitely limited at the present time, the price placed on the machine by Satake is not unreasonable. It may be just possible that I can sell this engine as an adjunct to one of the boats turned over to your office by the Vessels Disposal Committee. Apart from this possibility, I see no hope of a sale at the present time.

As regards Satake's trunk, this was shipped on 24th September consigned to the Custodian at Vancouver. I may say that I have recently had a letter from Mr. Fisher of the Security Commission asking about this and several other shipments. I will appreciate it if you will try to impress upon Mr. Fisher that release orders for effects stored in Prince Rupert should be sent to me, rather than to the individuals with whom the effect may happen to be stored. Otherwise, I can hardly be expected to keep track of things.

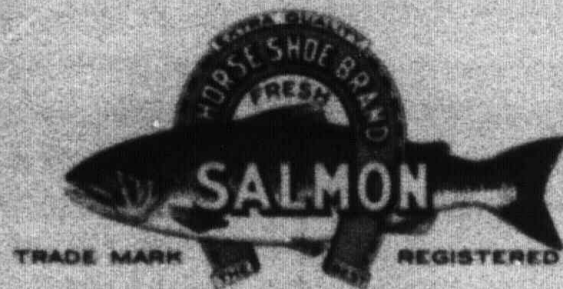


