In his declaration to the Custodian, Yoshikazu MAYEDE stated that he had no assets or liabilities.

Life Insurance: On September 15, 1943, the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada forwarded to this office Form "D" on Policy No. 2,267,802, on the life of Yoshikazu MAYEDE. According to Form D, this Policy was taken out on November 1, 1938, and was a 20 year endowment plan. Kunitaro MAYEDE, father of the insured, was beneficiary. Premium payments of \$50.00 annually are in arrears, and as at October 30, 1945, the amount of \$199.26 was required to bring this Policy up to date.

Prior to his repatriation to Japan on June 17, 1946, MAYEDE requested that we deal with Sajiyo WAKITA of Revelstoke, B. C., in regard to his life insurance policy. We have written Mr. WAKITA and requested that he forward the policy to this office, should he be holding same for the above Japanese.


Specified Articles: Vessel "K.M."/"Y.M." was sold by the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee on May 29, 1942, for the net amount of \$344.00, which amount was paid direct to MAYEDE on June 1, 1942.

Fishing Equipment: On April 3, 1945, Yoshikazu MAYEDE advised the Custodian that he had left certain fishing nets at the Net House of the Star Cannery, Steveston, B. C., and wished to be advised of the disposition of same. Steps were taken by the Custodian to trace or locate the fishing equipment of this Japanese, but without success. No fishing equipment for the account of this Japanese was inventoried or taken over by the Custodian.

A rubber suit was auctioned at Steveston, B. C., on November 2, 1945, and the net proceeds of sale, amounting to \$1.47, were credited to the account of the above Japanese with the Custodian.

No property interests, other than those mentioned above, are found on this file.

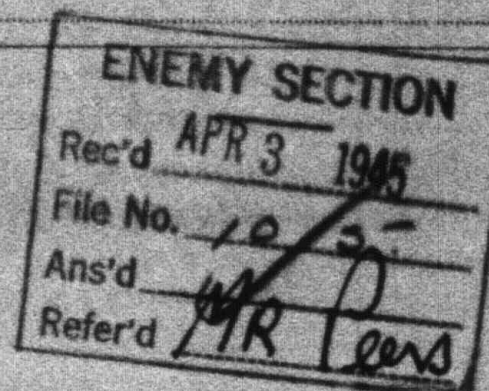


Your letter of February 26, 1948 to our Vancouver Branch Office contained a request for the cash surrender value of the above policy. With your letter was enclosed an application form for the surrender value, signed on behalf of the Custodian for both the assured and the beneficiary. We understand our Vancouver Office discussed this case with you and it is now ascertained that the following are the facts in this case:

- (1) That the assured and his father, Kunitaro Mayede, are both recorded as residents of Japan;
- (2) That the assured is indebted to the Canadian Government;
- (3) It is believed the policy is in possession of the assured;

and on this basis we are pleased to forward herewith a cheque for the amount involved, drawn to the order of the Custodian.

Under normal conditions we would require surrender of the policy before payment of the cash surrender value. No doubt request for payment to the Custodian is based on the terms of Bill 104, Emergency Powers, which provide for the continuation of Order in Council P.C.7355 dated December 15, 1945, as amended by Order in Council P.C.268 dated January 23, 1947. Because of that and relying on the protection of the Custodian in the event of a claim under the policy from any other source, we are willing to make payment of the cash surrender value without surrender of the contract. In the event that it does become available at some later date, it should, of course, be then delivered to the Company.


