GENERAL SUMMARY

This 26-year old Canadian-born Millworker from Port Alice, B. C., signed a Custodian "JP" declaration on the 23rd March, 1942. He was single at date of evacuation (March 25th, 1942).

The following is a summary of the contents of this file as disclosed by a review made today.

Real Property: None.

Chattels: Hone.

Accounts Receivable: None declared but refund of Provincial 15 wage deduction received and credited to this account in the sum of \$7.18.

Bonds, Shares, etc.: No action was taken by the Custodian with regard to Victory Bonds (\$100.00) and War Savings Certificates (\$35.00) declared to be in owner's possession.

Bank Accounts: A belance of \$416.49 declared to be in a Savings Account (No. 697) with the Port Alice branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia turned out to be \$114.33, which was turned over to this office (Dec. 21/43) at our request, but was returned to the Bank (Apr. 16/45) on learning that Bixo SAWADA was residing in Canada and not in Japan as had been assumed. Another belance of \$230.57, declared to be in an account with the Bast End branch of the Royal Bank of Canada, Vancouver, was not disturbed by this office.

Life Insurance: A Sun Life policy (No. 2,209,254) for \$1,000.00, declared (Mar. 23/42) to be in owner's possession, was subsequently turned in to the Company for its Cash Surrender Value (\$304.07), the Company's cheque for this amount being endorsed by the Custodian in place of the beneficiary, assured's father, Iso SAWADA, in Japan. Another policy for \$1,000.00, declared by this evacues - Matual Life No. 535509 - remained in his possession.

Liabilities: None.

Funds: There are no funds in this account at the present time and no further correspondence being expected this file is being closed today.

Dear Sirs: Ro: Sawada, Eyo (Eizo) With reference to your letter of December 27th, 1945, at which time you reported that your Port Alice, B.C., Branch, had forwarded a draft in favour of the Custodian for \$114.55, representing the balance of Savings Account No. 697 standing in the name of Eyo Sawada, I wish to advise as follows, Information which the Custodian has, indicates that contrary to the information reported to your Port Alice Branch, this party resides at Grimsby, Ontario, apparently having been evacuated from British Columbia, and his Bankers there are now endeavouring to obtain the money paid to the Custodian for his account and the Custodian is endeavouring to ascertain whether or not Lizo Sawada and Lyo Sawada are one and the same party. In an attempt to do this I have obtained the signature of the party that is at Grimsby, and am enclosing same with the request that you forward it to your Port Alice Branch and ascertain whether or not this is the signature that they have accepted as being the signature of the party who had the account with them.

Res Sum Life Policy No. 2,209,254.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 1st instant in which you ask the Custodian to endorse the Sun Life Assurance Company's cheque for \$304.07, representing the Cash Surrender Value of your policy.

In accordance with Insurance Companies' Regulations, in addition to your own signature, the signature of the beneficiary is also required, who, in this case is your father, Iso SAWADA, and who is recorded as being a resident of Japan.

Before deciding whether we are prepared to sign on his behalf we are asking you to supply us with information in regard to the upkeep of this policy since it has been in force.

- (1) The has paid the premiums? All by angelf.
- (2) From what source were the funds derived from which the premiums were paid?
- (3) For what length of time had the premiums been paid and what has been the total amount for same?
- (4) What is the cash surrender value of this policy at the present time?

Your father, on account of his close relationship to you, is what is termed "a preferred beneficiary". Have you any close relative residing in Gamada whom the Insurance Company would also consider in this preferred class and to whom, if you so wished, you could transfer the beneficial interest in this policy. Those included as "Preferred Beneficiaries" are wife, husband, father, nother, shildren or grandchildren.

Will you please advise us for what purpose you anticipated using the funds if the each value of the policy is withdrawn instead of keeping it in force for future protections

Should we agree to sign on behalf of the present beneficiary would you be prepared to accept a portion of the each surrender value leaving the balance to be placed to the credit of the beneficiary for the time being.

We are bolding this matter in abeyance until we hear further from you.
