The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on May 29/42 and was evacuated on June 1/42, declared the following goods at 1424 Commercial Drive, Vancouver, B.C.:

stove	dresser	chinaware	tables

When our representative went to this address these chattels could not be found and the above was so advised in our letter of Sept. 24/42. We also stated in this letter that we assumed he had disposed of his goods prior to his evacuation and asked him to confirm this assumption. No reply was received to this letter.

The file reveals the above owned no specified articles.

MONEYS
RECEIVABLE:

The account of the above was credited with the sum of \$5.43, being a refund from the Provincial Collector of 1½ wage deductions for the first six months of 1941.

On May 22, 1943, his account was credited with the sum of \$20.86, being a refund of National Defence Tax.

VICTORY BOND
& WAR SAVINGS
CERTIFICATES:

The above declared a \$50.00 Victory Bond and fifteen \$10.00 War Savings Certificates. He cashed two of his War Savings Certificates and the money from sale of same in the sum of \$16.16 was remitted to this office through the B.C. Security Commission. This money was to apply on his debt to Dr. Leith Webster. The Bond and the other Certificates did not come under our control.

LIFE
INSURANCE:

The above declared an insurance policy with the Crown Life Insurance Co. in the sum of \$2500.00. This is a joint policy with his wife, Yoshie, ~~whose name is not on the policy~~. This policy did not come under the control of the Custodian.

The balance in the account of the above is \$21.45.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

Dear Sir:

We enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the sum of \$21.45, being your entire credit balance with this office, and we are therefore closing your file.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you made your declaration to the Custodian on May 29th, 1942, you declared chattels at 1424 Commercial Drive, Vancouver, B.C. When our agents went to this address they were unable to find these chattels and you were advised of this in our letter of September 24th, 1942. We stated in this letter that as the chattels were not there we assumed that you had either sold everything or otherwise disposed of them prior to your evacuation. As we received no reply to this letter, we presume this was the case.

You declared fifteen \$10.00 War Savings Certificates and one \$50.00 Victory Bond, in your own possession. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian. You did send us, however, through the B.C. Security Commission, the sum of \$16.16, being the cash value of two \$10.00 War Savings Certificates. This sum was applied, together with \$4.84 from your credit balance with this office, towards the settlement of the claim filed against you by Dr. Leith Webster in the sum of \$35.00, which was settled in full for \$21.00. This settlement was made at your request.

Your account has been credited with the sum of \$20.86, being a refund of National Defense Tax for 1942, and \$5.43, being a refund of 15% wage deductions for the first six months of 1941.

You declared a life insurance policy with the Crown Life Insurance Company in the sum of \$2500.00. This policy was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.
