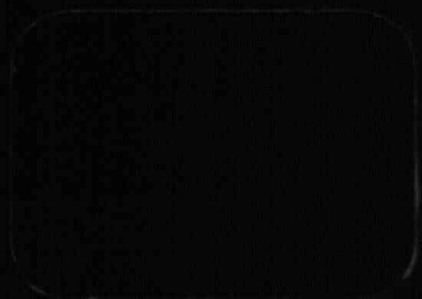

MEMORANDUM Re: Fishing Vessel, Licence NW.3364

The vessel carrying gasboat licence New Westminster 3364, name "Y.N.", was sold by the Custodian on March 8, 1943, to Joe Hunter for the sum of \$350.00. Information regarding this sale will be found on Enemy File 283-41.

This vessel was formerly licenced in the name of Mankichi NISHI (Japan) under licence New Westminster 938, and was transferred by NISHI to his nephew, Kaneo NAKATSU, Internee File 1027, for the sum of \$1.00, prior to NISHI's departure for Japan on November 1, 1941. This transfer was not recognized by the Foreign Exchange Control Board, and has not been recognized by the Custodian.

This vessel was reported to the JFVDC as the "K.N." NW.3364, Naval No. NW.083-H, owned by Kaneo NAKATSU.

The vessel is shown on the Naval List of Impounded Vessels as "M.N.12" NW.938, owned by M. NISHI.

The JFVDC file concerning this vessel is under the name "K.N." in the Released Vessels file; the vessel having been released to the Custodian from Naval custody in July, 1942.

Although Enemy File 283-41, Evacuee File 3177, and JFVDC File "K.N." all contain letters and memorandums stating that this vessel had been transferred to Kaneshiro NAKATSU (Evacuee File 3177), there is nothing to show that Kaneshiro NAKATSU had anything to do with this vessel. Kaneo NAKATSU, Internee File 1027, is a son of Kaneshiro NAKATSU, Evacuee File 3177.

This is in reply to your letter of March 6th stating that the above noted Internee claims he left a 200 fathom sockeye net at the Gulf of Georgia Cannery.

We have checked over the files and find that the five following nets were purchased direct from Kaneo NAKATSU on May 22, 1942 for which he was paid \$620.00 in cash:

1. 12/40 x 10 1/8" x 35 x 200 Fath. with lines \$160.00
 2. 9/40 x 9 1/4" x 40 x 170 Fath. no lines 150.00
 3. 6/40 x 6 1/2" x 50 x 150 Fath. 1/2 lines 100.00
 4. 4/40 x 5 13/16" x 50 x 150 Fath. with lines 80.00
 5. 4/40 x 5 3/4" x 50 x 200 Fath. with lines 120.00
- \$620.00

No nets belonging to the above were purchased through the Custodian and to the best of our knowledge these were all the nets that the above named owned. It might be added that nets no. 4 and 5 are both sockeye nets with the latter 200 Fathoms so possibly he has forgotten it was sold.

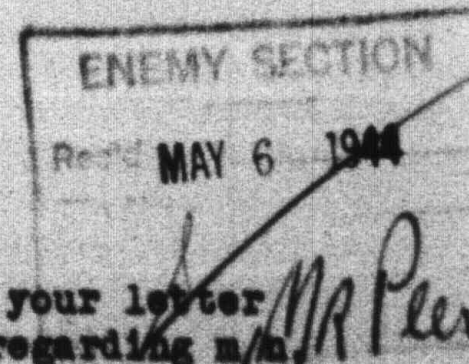



RE: Kanoo NAKATSU (Repatriate)
and Fishing Vessel NW 3364

The above noted boat was sold by the Custodian on March 8, 1943, to Mr. Joe Hunter, for the sum of \$350.00.

Notwithstanding the fact that Mankichi NISHI had transferred the license of this boat to his nephew, Kanoo NAKATSU, prior to his return to Japan on November 1st, 1941, the net proceeds of sale, amounting to \$200.90 were placed to the credit of NISHI'S account with the Custodian, in which account they are still held.

Kanoo NAKATSU is now being repatriated to Japan and has forwarded to us the license of this boat, dated November 13, 1941, showing same to be registered in his name. We attach this license for your perusal.

In view of the above, we would appreciate receiving your comments in regard to the transfer of the net proceeds of sale herein, namely \$200.90, from the account of Mankichi NISHI (In Japan) to the credit of Kanoo NAKATSU.


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:


