

On the 21st. inst. the Subject was found in the Japanese section of this city, upon questioning him he claimed to be a member of the staff employed in the cook house at the Hastings Park Manning Pool, he had the proper identification card but had no pass from the Park. Subject was held at the Immigration Bldg. until the Park could be checked, however in the meantime the Subject stated before Cst. W.C. Wallace and the writer that he refused to leave the Protected Area, he was therefor arrested and handed over to the Military Guard at the Immigration Bldg. Receipt obtained and is attached hereto.

2. Subject was in possession of a cheque in favor to the value of \$392.70, forms 246 covering same are attached.

The valuations shown would indicate that the boat was worth more than \$250.00.

Re: Personal effects of Internees.

We have a letter from the British Columbia Security Commission relative to personal effects of several internees. Copy of this communication is enclosed.

We have not examined the contents of the suitcases and boxes but it occurs to us if they contain warm clothing you might find use for the articles in camp and may wish to turn them over to the owners rather than to allow the goods to remain in storage.

It will be noted from the enclosed letter that the majority of the internees have credit balances with us; we have inserted the amount in red type; so that we could pay the charges if you wish us to send the goods. We do not know what facilities you have for storage and it may be that you would not permit them to wear their ordinary outside clothing.

If you would like us to make an examination and send you the list, this will be done upon receipt of your instructions.


