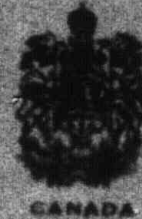

Subject was questioned as to why he left the restricted area of L.P. under any circumstances. Subject was placed under arrest and handed over to the Military Guard at the Canadian Immigration Building, receipt for his living body is being held on file here.

2. Subject is described as follows: Age 34 years, Height 5'8" Weight 145 lbs., Complexion yellow, Dark eyes, Dark hair, Bald on nose.

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
Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:
