PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

CHATELS: The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 3rd, 1942, and was evacuated on April 26th, 1942, declared the following chattels:

A Boat, in the custody of the R.C.M.P.
Nets valued at \$775.00, left at the Canadian Fishing Co.
House furnishings valued at \$300.00 and kitchen utensils valued at \$200.00, all left in care of the Scottish Cannery, operated by the Canadian Fishing Co.

Nets tagged with the name of the above were found at the Gulf of Georgia Cannery, operated by the Canadian Fishing Co., and were inventoried by our Steveston representative, Mr. C.C. Robinson. Two of these nets were sold ~~direct~~ to the Cannery for the sum of \$255.00, and the remainder of the nets moved to the Custodian net house and sold under Custodian numbers 46, 48 and 49, for the sum of \$91.30, making a total of \$346.30 received for the nets. This amount was credited to the account of the above. We sent him a copy of the net statement on November 22nd, 1943, at his request and on November 23/44 he wrote and asked to have these funds remitted to him. A cheque for this entire amount was remitted to him on December 12/44.

Chattels belonging to the above, together with those belonging to Genjiro KIMURA, File 2490, Kazuo KIMURA, File 1837 and Genkichi MIYAI, File 1141, were all stored in the house occupied by Unosuke SAKAMOTO, File 4933, at the Scottish Canadian Cannery (operated by the Canadian Fishing Co.). All chattels from this house were moved by barge on August 4, 5 and 6, 1942, as per List #37, in the name of the occupant, Unosuke SAKAMOTO. These goods were sold at auction and the proceeds credited to the account of Unosuke SAKAMOTO. However as it is very likely that some of these articles belonged to the other people who had goods stored with those of SAKAMOTO, all funds derived from sale of these chattels are being frozen until the proper owners can be positively identified.

A memo on chattels List #37 states that the houses at the Scottish Canadian Cannery had all been broken into and thoroughly ransacked. It also states that small stuff which was packed on the 4th and 5th of August ready for the barge on the 6th of August, had been well pilfered so a good deal of the most valuable articles may well be missing as a result.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: According to information supplied to this office the above was the owner of a fishing vessel the "ARBUTUS", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$1,331.50, and this sum was paid to Tokichi KIMURA through his Attorney Mr. U. SAKAMOTO on May 22nd, 1942. Full details of this are given on the Specified Articles Summary on file.


We are placing on the files of the above named Japanese a list of what the Japanese declared, a list of goods removed from the Scottish Canadian Cannery by the Custodian and a list of the goods surmised by the Custodian.

It appears that the above Japanese all stored their furniture in the house of Shozo Sakamoto and they were removed under the name of Sakamoto as no identification tags were on the chattels. It is also noted, on the removal slip, the following notation:

"These houses have all been broken into and ransacked thoroughly. We picked up small stuff on the 4th & 5th, but when we came to move on the 6th the small stuff had been well pilfered."

It is impossible for this office to identify the chattels sold, therefore, we have transferred the funds derived from these sales to Suspense Account so that this may be dealt with at a later date.
