

and chattels on land of Bill Smith, S. C.

Attached are two letters received from Mr. W. S. Hally, Hally
Hingle Hill, Hingle Island, S. C. I have been unable to trace the inquiry
mentioned in Mr. Hally's letter of April 6, 1946. It is possible that some
of the three files listed above are concerned in the chattels stored at
Bill Smith. From the three files referred to I have obtained the following
information:

File 612. Johannes JOHNSON, Reg. No. 10146 Declared 3 beds, 1 kitchen
stove, 1 wash basket, 2 sideboards, stored in a shack on fleet. No record
of sale or shipment.

File 637. Mrs. (Mrs. Johannes) JOHNSON, Reg. No. 10147 Declared in addition
to the 3 beds and stove reported by her husband, 3 chairs, 1 table and kitchen
stove. On May 21, 1943, Mr. Hally reported that he had shipped four boxes
of kitchen utensils to Mrs. JOHNSON.

Reference File 1001. William WILSON, Reg. No. 10111 Declared, 1 complete brass
bed, 1 bureau, 1 kitchen stove, 1 camp heater stove, 1 kitchen cabinet, 1 dining
table, 3 chairs, 1 small wooden table, 3 brass dinnerware, 1 box kitchen utensils,
1 Alaska coal oil lamp, 1 gas stove, approx. value \$2000.00, stored in
camping house. He later reported that his chattels were stored in fleet house
belonging to Johannes JOHNSON, File 612. The Alaska lamp was stolen during
Mr. Hally's absence in 1943.

At the time the lamp was stolen a tool chest belonging to an unidentified
Mr. WILSON. Theft reported by Mr. Hally December 16, 1943.

According to reports from Mr. Hally all the goods belonging to WILSON
that he had knowledge of were stored in the fleet house belonging to JOHNSON.
This fleet house, according to letters received from Mr. Hally from time to time,
was being cared for by Mr. Hally to the extent that he moved it along with his
own equipment as he moved from place to place in his logging operations. In
1943, he reported in a letter "The care has been quite a problem and I would
like very much to be free of it", which is understandable.

It would seem that something should be done about these chattels and
fleet house to release Mr. Hally from this burden.

1 kitchen cabinet, 1 dining table,
3 chairs, 1 small bed-side table,
5 boxes chinaware, 1 box kitchen
utensils, 1 coal oil "Alladin" lamp,
1 gramophone; Approx. Value: \$250.

We should be much obliged if you would confirm
that these articles are as stated and will be cared
for during the absence of the owners. If they cannot
be safely stored where they are, we should request you
to pack and label them and ship them to Vancouver.

Will you kindly advise if other evacuated Japanese
have left effects behind at Call Creek, and if so, give
the names and details of the property. We should also
be glad of your recommendations as to their safe keep-
ing or disposal.

Dear Sir:-

Your letter of April 25 received.

The goods which you mention are here stored in a shack on a float belonging to Ichikawa Ishinosuke.

I was given orders to sell if possible at the sum you mention \$250.00, or keep it until their return, but as the price is far too much I know it won't be sold, however at present it is no task to look after these things and it would be quite a job to pack and ship them as no boat calls here now and my boat is very small to freight heavy articles any distance. But when this camp starts in operation again the boat will call and it would be much easier then if you should wish them shipped. I do not know of any other effects left by evacuated Japanese. The rest of the camp belongs to Mrs. Takabashi as far as I know, with the exception of my house and shingle mill which is all tied up in a bay seven miles in Call Creek.

Trusting this is satisfactory.



Thank you very much for your letter of December the 3rd and your kindness in giving us all the information.

We notice that a box of tools belonging to Mr. Tsunao (whom in the absence of further information, we assume to be the gentleman whose name is given on the head of this letter) and an Aladdin Lamp belonging to Ushijima have been stolen. This is a matter we have quite some trouble with in isolated places and we thank you for what you have done to trace the missing articles.

We notice that the Float House belonging to Mr. and Mrs. Ichikawa will probably have to be beached before long, for the time being the contents are safe enough and may stay where they are. This seems very satisfactory for the time being and we should be much obliged if you would continue to offer your good offices in keeping an eye on this man's things. Later on, we may have to come to some decision about shipment or their disposal and we will then, if we may, apply to you for your advice and assistance.

Finally, we have had a call from a Chinese who is anxious to purchase the Logging Camp on Floats at Culls Creek, Crockett Island, belonging to Mr. K. Takahashi. We will contact Mr. Takahashi and if he is willing, will request Mr. Loong, the purchaser to contact you. Perhaps you will be so kind as to show him anything he wants to see.

Dear Sir:-

Your letter dated February 14th just received. In which you enquire about the Japanese household effects which were left with me.

Yes they are all here with the exception of the float house which broke up or I guess you would say ate up by the storehouses and gradually fell to pieces. I took out all the stuff through and for quite awhile had it covered with equestrian, but since people built a bank house and I have it stored in there now.

You mention if a sale could be arranged. Well I don't know as anyone around here would

be interested in it as the furniture is mostly home made and rather a crude manufacture and what is bought is a little out of season. The little cook stove is rusted beyond use but the two cast iron heaters could be repaired and would last awhile.

However I would be very glad to get it out of the way, but to ship it by Union Steam Ship I imagine they wouldn't take it unless it was crated and my opinion is that the lumber for crating would cost more than the stuff is worth. But the B C Steamship would call right here at camp and it might be arranged that they could pick it up uncrated as a few more scratches would never be noticed.

However I will await your reply
