## INTERNMENT OPERATIONS

#### RETURN OF PRISONERS OF WAR CLASSES 1 OR 2 TRANSFERRED, RELEASED OR DECEASED

(a) In cases of transfer of prisoners to another Internment Camp this form will be completed in triplicate and original and duplicate forwarded with the prisoners to the Commandant to whose custody they are being transferred, who will in turn complete the form in respect to new General Numbers and his signature, and forward original directly to Commissioner of Internment Operations at OTTAWA.

(b) In cases of transfer of prisoners to the custody of another authority beyond the control of Internment Operations, this form will be completed in triplicate and the original, when signed by the Officer i/c Escort as an acknowledgment of receipt of prisoners, shall be dated and signed by the Camp Commandant and forwarded directly to the Commissioner of Internment Operations, OTTAWA. The duplicate will be handed to the Officer i/c Escort. The triplicate will be placed on Camp files.

(c) In case of release or death of prisoner this form shall be prepared in duplicate and the original forwarded directly to Commissioner of Internment Operations, OTTAWA.

I write you on behalf of Hireshi Yamada, Japanese Registration No.05757, concerning his personal effects which were lost at the Angler Internment Comp. He was at this Internment Comp from the month of July 1948, to February 1945. He was taken from there to a hospital at Fort Arthur and then to Fort William and finally to a Mental Respital near here, from which institution he was recently released.

He informs me that at the time he was taken to Angler Interpment Cemp, he had a suit case and a dumnage beg containing 1 suit (brown), 1 everceat, 2 pre, of dress pants, 1 sport jacket, 1 zipper jacket, 1 pr. shoes (brown), 1 pr. sheets, 3 pre, blankets (grey), 3 pre, of socks, t ties, 3 dress shirts, 3 sport shirts, 2 suspenders, 5 sources, etc.

T saw Mr. Tameda when he was brought to Vancouver in August 1943, and I noticed that he had nothing with him and I was then told that all his belongings were left at the said internment camp.

Planse be good enough to advise me who now has the custody of Mr. Tamada's belongings.

Hiroshi IMADA was interned on June 19, 1942. In September, 1943, this office was informed that he had been released from internment and had been committed to Essendale Mental Hospital.

On August 14,1943, the Custodies requested the Comp Commundant, Angler Intermsent Comp, to forward to GOA East Cordove Street, the personal baggage of Hiroshi YAMALA. The Costodies asked the Comp Commandant to inform us of his action in regard to this. We do not appear to have received either the personal effects or any information in regard to shipment of these effects.

On May IL, 1964, the Commandent, Angler Anterment Comp, informed this office that the father of Hiroshi Talkala had requested shipment of the son's personal effects. At that time one suitonse was stored at the camp for

On June 5, 1944, the Custodian wrote to the Comp Commundant and to the B. C. Security Cosmission. We informed the Cosmandant that we were writing the Commission in regard to the shipment of those goods to the father of Biroshi FAMADA. We advised the B. C. Security Commission that noither the Commodust nor the Custodian had funds to the credit of Hiroski Islians, and asked themto smooly the sound Custodian Release form, upon receipt of which we would be leased to ask the Commandant to make shipment to the father provided transportation charges are arranged). Our lotters of June 5, 1924, are the end of our records of these personal effects. From which we judge that either the Commission arranged whipment without informing the Custodian or that transportation charges could not be arranged and the goods were left at ANGLER.

If you have any information in regard to these goods, we would be pleased to receive it.
