PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

The only asset of the above noted Japanese person consisted of 7 - \$5.00 War Savings Certificates and 3 - \$10.00 War Savings Certificates. Said Certificates were surrendered by the Custodian for their cash value on December 27, 1944, and proceeds of same forwarded to the Internment Camp for the credit of this Internee.

A cheque, amounting to \$4.11, representing refund of 1% wage deductions for the first 6 months of 1941, was received by this office from the Provincial Collector, and credited to this Internee's account. These funds were ultimately remitted to the Internee at the Camp and his account with the Custodian was closed out on October 20, 1945.

No property interests, other than those mentioned above, appear on this file.


