PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS:

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 3/42 and was evacuated on April 26/42, declared 6 nets, 10 cork and lead lines at the Colonial Cannery of the B.C. Packers Ltd. While he declared no chattels, the file reveals in our memo of March 12/46, a list of chattels extracted from record books of the B.C. Packers Ltd. covering the Colonial Cannery. A reference to the file of his wife Toku, File 1133, reveals that she declared some chattels which are dealt with on this file and are also shown on the Chattel Schedule on file. At our request, the above sent us a completed net form on Feb. 2/43. Nets and gear found tagged with the name of the above were inventoried by Custodian agent, C. C. Robinson, at the Colonial Cannery net house and given Custodian numbers 716-722. These have been sold as noted on the net statement of Feb. 24/44 for the sum of \$49.38. Custodian Nos. 718, 720 and 721 may have been sold and funds credited to Net Suspense Account or they may have been discarded as of no value. Net No. 717 was appraised by C. P. Leckie on Nov. 4/43 as of no value. Four sets of cork line and 4 sets of lead line belonging to the above were sold direct to Nelson Bros. Fisheries for the sum of \$107.50, and this together with the sum of \$49.38 received for the other nets was credited to the account of the above with this office. Chattels found in Colonial Cannery House #8 marked with the name of the above were inventoried on July 7/42 by C. C. Robinson as per List #91 on file and on Aug. 13/42 as per List #45 on file and removed to central storage. These goods have been sold as noted on the Schedule for the net sum of \$38.43 and this sum credited to the account of the above. A statement of his account was sent to YAMAMOTO on Sept. 4/43 at his request.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

According to information supplied to this office the above was the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "SEA QUEEN", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$591.50, and of this amount \$583.50 was paid to YAMAMOTO and the balance in the sum of \$8.00 was paid to the B. C. Packers Ltd. in payment of a claim they had against the vessel. Full details are given on Specified Articles summary on file.

On March 10/42 a radio, Phonola model, was handed over to the R.C.M.P. by Eiji MIYAZAKI on behalf of the above. This radio was handed over to the B.C.S.C. on Aug. 9/43 for shipment to the owner. His account was debited with \$1.00 storage charges on the radio.

VICTORY BONDS:

The above declared one \$50.00 Victory Bond and 1 War Savings Certificate in his own possession. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.



LIFE

INSURANCE:

Although the above did not declare life insurance we were advised through the Sun Life Assurance Co. that YAMAMOTO had applied for the cash surrender value of his policies and we advised the company on April 5/43 that we had no objection to the cash surrender value cheques being paid direct to the above. The B.C.S.C. were also advised of this in our letter of June 2/43.

It will be noted that he has been remitted the sum of \$2.88 more than the total of amount received from sale of chattels, nets. Apparently the B.C. Packers Ltd. paid Mr. Harris separately for an item of (in one place called cedar floats and in another corks) and also paid for this item in a cheque paying for a number of nets, so that the sum has been credited to YAMAMOTO twice.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.



With reference to our letter of May 29th and yours of June 2nd, we wish to advise that the motor vessel carrying Naval Control No. NW.041-E was sold by Sosuke Yamamoto to Luke Francis Swan, of Ahousat, B. C.

This vessel is described as follows:

It was formerly licensed New Westminster 3074, and is now licensed New Westminster 3379 and has been re-named "Swan."

In connection with our requests for information in regard to naval control numbers, we might point out that the naval list of impounded vessels shows naval control numbers in preference to any other identification. However, these vessels were not released from custody under naval control numbers (nor were they necessarily released under the names shown on the naval list). In order that unjustified claims against the Canadian Government may be dealt with, it is necessary that the name shown on the naval list of impounded vessels be tied up to the name under which the boat was released from custody, and the naval number is frequently the only means by which this can be done. Your assistance in regard to vessels which, according to the records, were impounded by Naval Service, but which, according to the records, were not released from naval custody, would be appreciated. 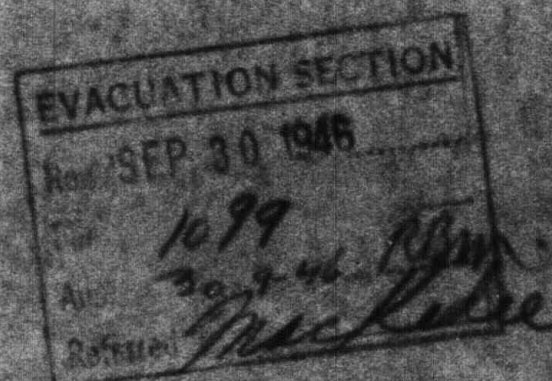

MR. CHENOWETH: I ask leave to amend, Your Honour.  
This claim is all for personal chattels, con-

is \$455.00 - - -

THE COMMISSIONER: You are filing the statement  
and I won't need to mark that down?

We are withdrawing our claim as to these. In view of the fact that we are withdrawing these items, in Exhibit 1 we itemize all fishing gear for which claim is made, showing the estimated values, the Custodian's comment taken from the Analysis, Exhibit 3, so that the final column in Exhibit 1 shows that two nets were sold for \$10.00 and \$35.00 respectively, and the following four items are shown not accounted for, theft, etc., and at the bottom the anchor and cedar corks, there is the price for which they were sold and at the foot of the page we have shown the total claim.

THE COMMISSIONER: Which is?

MR. CHERNIAK: I am speaking of Exhibit 1, Your Honour.

THE COMMISSIONER: \$363.62?

MR. CHERNIAK: Yes, Sir. In this Exhibit the Claimant sets out the original value and his estimated value at date of evacuation. He indicates that all these nets were stored at the Colonial Cannery and inventoried by the Custodian. From Exhibit 3 it is shown that the Custodian does not dispute the inventory of these nets and it therefore shows that they either sold the goods or they were not accounted for, theft, etc., in other words, they were not located by the Custodian. In Exhibit 2 the Claimant also sets out his full claim itemizing the four different items, showing the year in

which they were purchased, the price paid and his estimated value. And in Exhibit 2 we have also shown the Custodian's comments as taken from Exhibit 3, showing the prices received from the sales and that the two stoves are not accounted for, theft, etc.

Q Mr. Yamamoto, you show that the beds, chairs and stoves were all bought in 1940; what happened in 1940 that you came to buy all these goods? A The Cammerly built me a new house in 1940 and that is the reason I bought that furniture.

MR. CHENILAK: That is all, Your Honour.

MR. FERG: It is submitted Your Honour that the property sold for its fair market value and that the claim for the articles lost through theft and so on, while in the custody of the Custodian, that the values and prices claimed is excessive and unreasonable.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. FERG:

Q The valuations of the things you claim are your own valuations?

A Yes.

Q And you had no one give you an independent valuation of any of these goods?

A No.

Q What is the average life of a fishing net in your experience? A It could be used for five or six years but it won't be as good

now. It depends on the way you use it.

Q How long have you been a fisherman?

A Sixteen years.

Q And have you found that you can use a net for five or six years?

A It depends on the way you use it, but it can be used for five or six years.

Q Have you ever found a net to last five or six years? A Yes.

Q Now, then, other fishermen have given evidence in other cases here in which they state there is one particular type of fishing where they claim that the nets will last three or four years and in another case where it lasts four or five years, and now you come along and say five or six years? A It depends on the type of net. A 6 1/2 is only a Seasonal net and you don't use it long enough.

Q You had some 6 1/2 nets? A No, but the same applies to the 7 inch net, the season is very short.

MR. FERG: All right.


