PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

June 28, 1946.

Re: Yeichi MIZUYABU, Reg. No. 11047

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942.
He was evacuated on May 14, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a fishing boat in custody at New Westminster. The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this boat was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$641.00 were paid to MIZUYABU on April 2, 1942.

He reported furniture, kitchen utensils and a coho fishing net left at Inverness Cannery, Skeena River. Our records show that all these effects with the exception of the coho net were shipped in May, 1942 to MIZUYABU. The coho net was sold to J. H. Todd & Sons and the net proceeds in the amount of \$15.00 were credited to this man's account.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office a Kodak Brownie Camera surrendered by this man. This camera is still on hand. *mailed to owner Aug 22/46*

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$50.25 received as refund of expenses incurred at the time of the impounding of his vessel, "Y.M."

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

At the present time there is a balance of \$65.25 standing to your credit with this office.

In your declaration to the Custodian on March 21, 1942 you reported a fishing boat in custody at New Westminster. The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee show that this boat was sold and the net proceeds of \$641.00 were paid to you on April 2, 1942.

You reported furniture, kitchen utensils and a coho fishing net left at Inverness Cannery. Our records show that all these effects with the exception of the coho net were shipped to you in May, 1942. The coho net was sold to J. H. Todd & Sons and the net proceeds of \$15.00 were credited to your account.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office a Kodak Brownie camera surrendered by you. This camera is still on hand and if you will send in the receipt given to you at the time the camera was surrendered we shall send your camera to you. The cost of mailing the camera will be approximately 25 cents and we will deduct the mailing cost from the balance standing to your credit and remit the remainder of the account to you.

Your account was credited with the sum of \$50.25 received as refund of expenses incurred by you at the time of the impounding of your vessel "Y.M."

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
