A refund in the amount of \$1.92 was received from the B.C. Electric Railway, being a security deposit for light and this amount credited to the account of the above. This sum, together with the \$4.48 credited to his account from sale of chattels makes a total of \$6.40 to his credit and a cheque for this sum is being sent to him with reporting letter.

RE: Hikojiro SHINKAWA, Reg. No. 93412

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 4th, 1942, and was evacuated on May 4, 1942, declared chattels and fishing equipment as per Chattel Schedule, left in care of the Colonial Cannery, Steveston.

The chattels, with the exception of the stove, were moved by our representative on July 7th, 1942 from House #7 to our storage warehouse #2 at Steveston. As the stove was not found at house #7, it is presumed the above took it with him or otherwise disposed of it at the time of his evacuation. The other goods inventoried were sold at auction for the net sum of \$4.48 and the proceeds credited to his account.

Two nets were sold by our Steveston agent for the sum of \$250.00 as per net statement of Feb. 5/44 on file, a copy of which was sent to the above on July 28th, 1944. This statement shows, in addition to the two nets sold, one unaccounted for, being Custodian number 707. It also shows cork and lead lines and one net (untagged), Custodian No. 708, which were not moved by us from the Colonial Cannery net loft. After receiving our net statement SHINKAWA wrote to us on August 9th, 1944, and asked us to try and trace the unaccounted four items and listed three more nets which he had not previously declared. We replied to this letter on August 25, 1944 and again on Oct. 7, 1944, stating that we had no record of any nets being sold in his name, other than those we had already advised him of, but that we were recording particulars of his claim for consideration if and when any decision is reached as to how matters of this kind should be dealt with. He replied on Nov. 16, 1944 asking that his entire credit balance with this office be remitted to him, and a cheque for this amount, namely \$250.00, was sent to him on Nov. 28, 1944.

Dear Sir:

We enclose herewith Custodian cheque in the sum of \$6.40, being your entire credit balance with this office.

Your file has been reviewed and the following is noted. In your declaration to the Custodian made on April 4th, 1942, you declared a stove and kitchen utensils to be left in care of the Colonial Cannery, Steveston, and 4 nets and 4 cork and lead lines, on the second floor of the Colonial Cannery net house, Steveston. The nets which we could identify as belonging to you were sold for the sum of \$250.00, and this amount was remitted to you on November 28th, 1944.

The chattels, with the exception of the stove, were sold at auction for the net sum of \$4.48 and this sum credited to your account. We assume the stove was either taken with you or sold prior to your evacuation as it was not found in the cannery house along with your other chattels when our representative called to remove these goods.

We received a refund in your favour from the B. C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd. in the sum of \$1.92, being a refund on your security deposit for light. This amount was credited to your account, and this sum, together with the \$4.48 received from sale of your chattels, makes up your balance of \$6.40.

You declared a \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in your own possession and this did not come under the control of the Custodian.

According to information supplied to this office, your fishing vessel was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$443.00, and this amount was paid to you on May 10th, 1942.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every ind left by you in the protected area which vested in the Custodian and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for convenience in replying.




