In his declaration he reported a box, a basket and logging tools left at Claxton Cannery, Skeena River. These were shipped to him on May 21, 1942.
received for shipment

He reported a \$4.00 War Savings Certificate in his own possession. This did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

The Provincial Mental Hospital, T. B. Unit, filed a claim for \$39.00 against this man. This was referred to NAKAMURA but no reply was received. As there is no credit balance for this man in this office we are taking no further action.

This file reveals no other liabilities of any kind.
