GENERAL SUMMARY

November 21st, 1945.

RE: Masae (Mrs. Sanii) MAYEGAWA, Reg. No. 03854

When the above made her declaration to the Custodian on April 4th, 1942, she declared the ownership of 2 stoves and 1 bed and stated these articles would be stored at the Cannery House assigned by the Canadian Fishing Co., Steveston. When our representative called to get these goods they could not be found. She was not evacuated until May 12th, 1942, so she may have disposed of these goods in the meantime.

She declared the sum of \$300.00 in the Royal Bank of Canada at Steveston. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Her file reveals no claims against her.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

The above summary is certified to be in accordance with the information on file.


Please note that the above has been repatriated to Japan. At the time of repatriation, the following transactions took place:
