The above made his declaration to the Custodian on April 4/42, was interned on June 24/42 and released July 17/43.

He declared chattels as listed on the Chattel Schedule on file left at House #24 - 5th Ave., Steveston, owned by the Canadian Fishing Co. Ltd.

On July 24/42, Mrs. Matsuyo KAWANO, File 11098, wife of the above, sent in a Custodian Release for 4 mattresses, 2 or 3 boxes of kitchenware. These apparently could not be found at this time as they were never shipped.

On Nov. 13/43 Custodian agent, Mr. C. C. Robinson reported that he had had an interview with Mr. Townsend, Manager of the Canadian Fishing Co. Ltd., and that Mr. Townsend had advised him that House #24 had been cleaned out by them, that there was nothing of value in the house and that what had been found by them was burned as rubbish.

However, on July 10/43, our agent, Mr. C.C. Robinson, inventoried chattels in the name of the above as per List #430 on file, found in a house owned by Y. NAKADE, File 9343, on Chatham St., Steveston. This house was used as a storage place by many other Japanese. The chattels on List #430 were moved to central storage and have been disposed of as shown on the Schedule. The goods sold at our Steveston auctions in the name of the above amounted to \$6.04, and this sum was credited to the account of the above. Certain goods appearing on List #430, as per our memo to Miss C. Girard, were not declared by the above, and the proceeds from their sale has been transferred to Chattel Suspense Account.

The claim, therefore, is in the amount of goods held by the Custodian. Katsumi claims 4 beds, a gramophone, glass cabinet, trunk, and other articles mentioned on Exhibit 1.

Q I show you a typewritten statement. Was this prepared in accordance with your instructions?

Chattels found by the Custodian and identified as belonging to you were sold at auction for the net sum of \$66.04, and this sum was credited to your account with this office.

According to information supplied to this office you were the registered owner of a fishing vessel, the "KIYOSHI", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$449.75, and this sum was paid to you on May 18th, 1942.

Your fishing vessel the "SEA SCOUT 111", was also sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$1,059.30, and this sum was paid to you on March 12, 1942.

You were also the registered owner of a fishing vessel, the "Sea Scout", which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the sum of \$1400.00. After paying off a mortgage of \$919.20 held by the B.C. Packers Ltd. and supervision costs of \$19.00, the balance in the sum of \$461.80 was paid to you on April 20th, 1942.

In July, 1945, your account was credited with the sum of \$1.06, being a refund from the B.C. Electric Railway Co. Ltd., security deposit for light.
